The Happenings





I have always been a fan of John the Baptizer. You just have to love that quirky character who appears in the scripture readings during the weeks before Christmas. He dressed in camel's hair clothing, ate locusts (yuk!) and wild honey, challenged those uppity Scribes and Pharisees (*But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit worthy of repentance."* – Matt.3: 7-8) and pointed everyone toward the one who was to come, the Messiah, the Prince of Peace.

As a kid I loved the fact that he was different (don't all adolescents feel different!?!?), that he challenged authority (doesn't every kid love to challenge authority!?!?), but I also liked his humility.

But when I was in seminary, I became more than just a fan of this prophet. I was seated in a classroom at Northern Baptist Seminary, listening to Dr. Charles Cosgrove (Professor of New Testament, my seminary advisor, and former interim preaching pastor at St. Peter UCC in Elmhurst). Charlie startled the class by proposing that the most authentic model for the church was John the Baptist! I remember thinking – does this mean we should all dress in strange clothes (I could be allergic to camel's hair!), eat bugs (UGH!!) and challenge authority? (Okay, I still like that part!)

Now while Charlie was a fan of the Apostle Paul, he really loved the Baptizer! And he went on to explain, that instead of the somewhat presumptuous claim that "we are the body of Christ," (One of Paul's well known metaphors for the church), focusing on being Jesus, the church would be better off if we all were more like John the Baptist. Charlie said, "Our job as Christians is forever and always to point to Jesus with our words and our actions. We are to join together in our life, ministry, and mission to be preparers of the way. We are to always be preparing the way for Christ to be known and to enter the lives of other people who don't yet know him!"

That afternoon in Charlie's class has never left me as I struggled and still struggle to live into what it means for us to be "the church of Jesus Christ", to be a community of people who believe in the Good News of Jesus. Imagine what this church, this faith community might become, might look like, how it might transform lives, if in our shared discipleship, we were always just pointing toward Jesus, and always working at becoming preparers of the way for our living Savior?

We don't have to wear strange clothes or eat bugs to do that. But sometimes we do need to challenge authority. And we do need to be fully aware that it's NOT ABOUT US. That's the humility part. Realizing that if the church is to grow and grow God's Kingdom, it must always be about Jesus.

I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. – Matthew 3:11

Please bear with us while we research and make a decision on purchasing a replacement system.



The Building and Grounds committee continues to meet weekly on Wednesdays to review and evaluate roof proposals based on the needs of our church. We have leaned more about the original design and construction of the roof from Bob Lee, who worked on the roof when it was first built. His knowledge and experience have been a huge benefit to the committee.

On a separate issue, we have discovered that we need to add gutters to correct the water drainage from out steep roofs. Our present system with scoffers and downspout can not keep up with the flow of water during a heavy rain. Over the years damage has occurred to the siding, windows and our building structure from rainwater overflows down the sides of the building. We have the approval from the SLT Board up to \$5,000.00 to install gutters as soon as possible to stop further damage to our building. We are looking at bids and will schedule the work soon.

Our building committee went out to see Norm and Ellie. Smiles appeared on Norm's face when we shared the latest updates to our roof research and other special projects that he has had a huge part in developing.

This group of men serving on the building and grounds are supporting various church events. They are helping with VBS set building, staging and setting tables for "Celebration of Life" events and the never-ending building and grounds projects. We will keep you posted when landscape projects are scheduled. Additional help is always appreciated.

The 2019 -2020 calendar is starting to take shape. We need your full cooperation to list your events and meetings on the church calendars. The ripple effect of not knowing that a group is meeting in the building affects others. We need to be respectful and communicate better.

They will be held in a private space where confidentiality is guaranteed. The time is from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. The registration fee is \$15 per person, which includes a workbook for private use. Scholarships are available if you cannot afford this fee.



1:58 Dear Friends at Yorkville Congregational Church,



My friend and Navigator coworker, Mica, describes our friendship this way: "We are so different but yet good friends and kindred spirits. How does God take two people from such different backgrounds, personalities, and experiences and bring them together? What brings us together is that differences don't make any difference in true friendships because you learn to put the differences away for the sake of the friendship. And you are committed to working things through out of love."

I am writing to you today to invite you into financial and prayer partnership with my friend, Mica Garrett. There are two ways you can partner in her ministry: 1) monthly support and 2) a matching gift.

Before I write more about those opportunities, let me tell you about this woman of big faith, a big calling and purpose and a big God. Mica is a valuable partner in the ministry of The Navigators in her growing contribution as an advocate for cultural awareness and diversity within the organization and the city. She also brings her years of experience in ministry to the ex-offender population. Herself an exoffender, Mica saw that better pre- and post-release strategies could help remedy the behaviors that

most often prevent ex-offenders from breaking the cycle of incarceration. She founded the ministry of Bridge to Freedom (B2F) based on those strategies. B2F provides male and female ex-offenders between the ages of 18 and 60 with one year of pre-release mentoring and discipleship and two years of post-release assistance, either via observation in their own home or, depending on their post-release requirements, through the organization's safe, welcoming, and valuesbased supportive housing. Mica serves as a consultant to The Navigators in ministry to this population.

Would you pray and consider becoming a prayer and financial partner with my friend and fellow Navigator, Mica? If you choose to give a one-time gift, the Navigators will match your gift up to \$1,000. In addition, Mica and I are trusting God for \$3,500 in monthly support for her ministry. 
