# The Happenings







During a Bible Study several months ago, we were discussing communion. So we talked a bit about the fact that we in the UCC believe that the bread and the cup are symbolic of Jesus' body and blood, and Catholics believe in what is known as transubstantiation, that in the act of sharing the "last Supper", the bread and the wine/grape-juice are actually changed into Jesus real body and blood. Someone asked me where that idea came from. I said I believe it comes from a passage in the 6<sup>th</sup> chapter of John, where Jesus says,

This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" So, Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever." He said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum. When many of his disciples heard it, they said, "This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" — John 6:56-60

But I also said, "Spoiler alert: Jesus said a lot of things that he never meant to be taken literally. Jesus liked to use metaphors. When Jesus was talking about big ideas, he'd use a metaphor to help get you thinking about what he was trying to teach, so your mind would work on it, dissect it, and hopefully, eventually begin to integrate it into your life. But if you had tunnel vision, like the Pharisees and Sadducees, and even his disciples sometimes, his use of a metaphor could make you feel like his teaching was as clear as mud."

I respect Catholic beliefs, because I respect the people that hold them, and honor their right to hold onto to what they believe is truth. However, I am grateful that in the UCC, we understand Jesus' teaching as metaphorical. We're pretty clear that the exhortation to eat his flesh and drink his blood was not a literal invitation for his followers to become cannibalistic. Nor do we believe that God must somehow "transubstantiate" bread and wine into Jesus body and blood so we can participate in full and abundant life Christ came to give all people. We believe that teaching was an invitation to take part in the day-to-day struggle that Jesus put himself through—to not simply be an observer, to not be a commentator, or interpreter, but to really invest ourselves in the same way he invested himself. To live as he lived, speaking the truth to power (and being willing to suffer the consequences of that action), welcoming the outcast, accepting the stranger, forgiving the sinner, loving all.

God doesn't call us to do God's work, to be a part of God's community/Kingdom for our sake, but for God's sake, and for the sake of the world. And because we human beings can often be self-centered and self-serving types, that's a hard lesson to hear, a hard one to understand, a difficult invitation to accept. Even when it's given to us in a metaphor!

Sometimes the heat can put the brakes on activities, but not at YCUCC. VBS was a huge success and I want to personally thank Barb Thurlby and everyone else who was involved in any way of making "To Mars and Beyond" a memorable experience for all the children who attended.

The Building and Grounds team continue to work on both the inside and outside of the church doing as much as they can with an extraordinarily slim budget. There are two pressing issues that need to be taken care of within the next month or two, but with the budget constraints, we can really use your help. A classroom window needs to be replaced and the west side of the building needs to be painted. So please check out the Giving Tree for tags to help with these expenses. There are six (6) \$50 tags to cover the \$300 cost of the window and ten (10) \$100 tags to cover the cost of the paint which is \$1,000 on the Giving Tree located in the Narthex. Your generosity in helping with these type of costs is very much appreciated. Building & Grounds is also continuing to finalize the plan and associated costs of replacing the shingled roof, both north and south sides. You will be learning more about this in the very near future.

We also know there is a growing frustration with the poor quality of the visual images that are being projected onto the sanctuary screen. This issue is currently being addressed by a church media team and are in the process of working with two media companies. We will be reviewing their recommendations about replacing our system and should have a final plan by the end of August.

Even though we have work ahead, there's always time for fun and fellowship so don't forget to mark your calendars for August 25<sup>th</sup> which is the annual church picnic. As always, there were be delicious picnic foods and fun for all. And the Bounce House will be back for the kids to enjoy!! Look for the signup sheets on the bulletin board in the Narthex for food, picnic items or to help with the planning or clean up. See Laurie Houle for more details.

We continue to work on open communications and always welcome your feedback and questions. The Annual Report for the 2018-2019 fiscal year will be published on August 30. We feel this report provides a clear synopsis of what has transpired and how much has been accomplished over the past year. But we are always looking at what we can do today and in the coming months to keep our church strong and on a path of growth.

The Building and Grounds committee continues to meet weekly on Wednesdays reviewing roof proposals and to complete a few projects. With the roof rebuilt, we have run into another snag, what to do about replacing the skylights. We have three skylights, one in the sanctuary and two in the Narthex. They need to be removed in order to install the new roof. At their age and condition of the plastic panels, they might just shatter. We are investigating to see how to handle this new wrinkle in the project. Good news, we did receive additional money from the insurance company to cover damage from the May 27<sup>th</sup> hail and rainstorm. We have two checks, one from the old insurance company for \$17,000 and now \$20,500 from our current insurance company. We may be entitled to additional funds if we proceed with the roof rebuild in a reasonable time frame. Once we know how to handle the skylights, we will be ready to make our recommendation to the SLT leadership team.

With this very wet spring and summer and the high temperatures, our weeds and bushes have grown out of control. Fred Anderson came over in that 90-degree weather and weeded the front gardens. Andy started trimming bushes and the men have sprayed and plan to do more soon. As soon as we have a workday plan, e-mails we will be sent out for a workday. Many hands help lighten the load.

We have several other jobs scheduled to be done yet this summer and early fall:

Two classroom windows need to be replaced with fixed windows

Painting the lower west side of the building

Rent a small dumpster and clear out the debris behind the garage

Have the parking lot seal coated and striped

We have started working on a proposal for new signage for the street corner that would promote church programs and events

We need to schedule your meetings and events on the church calendar so that we do not step on each other's programs. It just takes a minute to send an email or call and share your information with me. So, then I can put it on the church calendar, web calendar and give the information to Liz for the weekly bulletin.
