
I am also so thankful that we have a signed contract to replace our shingled roof and that we can wait until the spring to have the work done. This means that we have several months in which to raise the remaining funds that are needed for this work. I am also grateful to learn we have been given generous donations towards this project so that instead of needing to raise \$37,000, we now only need to raise \$22,000. That is still a big sum, but it's not insurmountable. The leadership team will continue to focus on how to raise the needed funds and will be communicating the details about plans on achieving our end goal. In the meantime, if you can make a donation designated for the roof, please feel free to do so at any time. Just make sure your donation has a designation of "For the Roof".

In addition to raising funds, we are continuing to work on other outstanding issues such as replacing our media system and enhancing our ability to reach those seeking a church or unable to attend a service through our website and Facebook tools as well as adding an on-line donation process.

Our calendar is full of activities and I want to shout out a big "Thank You" to everyone who is involved in these events such as Mission Soup Sundays, LYN and PADS and all other groups that continue to give love and support to our members and those outside of our church walls.

Thanksgiving is just around the corner and I hope that you, your family and friends will plan to join us again this year for our church Thanksgiving dinner after worship service on Sunday, November 24th. I also hope that your traditional Thanksqiving is filled with the love of God in your hearts and that you have the

Our team of building and grounds men have been busy getting ready for the winter season. The floor heat has been turned on and all the thermostats set. Andy Hamblin has been busy getting the garage organized for the winter. The men have installed two new windows in classroom #7 and #6. The exterior window trim work is done and now they are completing the interior window trim.

The parking lot has been seal-coated and striped. Sealcoating was just a temporary fix. We have been advised that the whole parking lot does not need to be replaced, just certain areas. Next spring we will be evaluating the areas of concern in our parking lot that need to be cut out and re-surfaced. This additional work will be done in stages to help spread out the expense to our budget.

We are aware that several light fixtures in the parking lot are not working. This safety issue will be addressed immediately.

We have been asked by the SLT board to add to our agenda, the idea of creating a memorial garden on our property. At their last meeting, several ideas were suggested, and our ministry will be working with Pastoral Care in looking at possible concepts.

A big thank you is extended to YCUCC's membership who helped and donated to a hugely successful Rummage & Bake Sale Sept. 20th & 21st.






Many volunteers came together to form both Set-Up & Tear-Down Crews, plus helped with sorting, pricing, and baking Monday thru Thursday.


