We have several (3) groups in the church who are now engaged in the latest UCC Bible study curriculum which is called "The Listen Up Bible Study". The curriculum covers a number of our Bible's books, but not all. One of those covered is the Gospel of John. And all three groups have decided that they wanted to study John.

The Spiritual Formation group began the first section of John in our last meeting. I am glad, because I have always enjoyed John's Gospel. It is the most mystical of the 4 gospels. John's main themes are light and darkness, seeing and blindness (not seeing), and it has the highest Christology of the all the gospels. That means the writer(s) of John focus(es) on Jesus divinity or "god-ness" more than any of the other gospels – recall the open of the Gospel: *In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was With God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made.* Jesus has been with God from the beginning of God, and was part of the creative process that created everything! That's HIGH Christology!

One of my professors in seminary used to call the Gospel of John the "House of Seven Gables Gospel". If you recall, the House of Seven Gables had many secret passages – you could be in one room, open a panel in a wall, and walk up or down hidden stairways or down hidden hallways and come out into another room, unnoticed by anyone who might be in the main hallways of the house. Well, in John's Gospel, there are many passages in the gospel that lead you forward or back to other passages in the gospel. Let me give you an example.

I read a devotion this week that was on John 1:35-42. It is just after Jesus' baptism, and John is standing with two of his disciples. Jesus walks by and John says, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples follow Jesus, and at one point Jesus stops and turns around and asks them, "What are you looking for?" The two ask where he is staying. Jesus says, "Come and see." They came to where he was staying and stayed with him for the rest of that day. Then one of them, Andrew, found his brother, Simon (Peter), and told him, "We have found the Messiah!"

In John 18:1-15, Jesus has had his final meal with his disciples, washed their feet, and then gone out to the garden to pray. Soon Judas leads a detachment of the Temple Police who come with lanterns and torches and weapons. Jesus asks who they are looking for. We are reminded of Jesus question at the very start of the gospel when Andrew and James were following him – What are you looking for?

The connection of the two events draws a sharp contrast between those two disciples who followed Jesus because they were seeking the Messiah, and were able to "SEE" that Jesus was the Messiah, and the Temple leaders (the Chief Priests and the Pharisees) who have been plotting to kill Jesus for the last 6 chapters of the Gospel, because they cannot "SEE" (are blind) who Jesus is, and what he came to reveal.

The point of the contrast the writer creates is to help us, the readers, see that we must seek Jesus with open minds and hearts, without presumptions, with eyes willing to see what he wants to reveal to us so we might live fuller, richer, more abundant lives, and make it possible of others to do the same. Andrew and James came seeking, and saw. The Chief Priests and Pharisees claimed they were waiting for the Messiah, but they could not see him because their hearts and minds were occupied with other things, and not open to receive The Messiah.

Each of us, at different times in our lives, stand where all those who encountered Jesus stood in the 1st Century. We hear Jesus' words, but for us to "SEE" what Jesus came to reveal, we must not allow our hearts and minds to be focused on other things – they must be open to receive him.

What are you looking for in your life this week? Happiness? Security? Or maybe relief from some stress, or pain, or struggle? The best way to find it, is to first look for Jesus, with an open heart and open mind. He is the way that leads to all you really need in life. He is the truth that sets you free from all that shackles, holds you back, and the things that imprison you. He is the life that God created you to live. And only He can help you "SEE" that.

Didn't we just welcome in the New Year and yet here we are already at the beginning of our second month of the year and with an added bonus of a "Leap Day" on February 29th. I pray that I will not only use this gift of time and every other day to remember and to be thankful for all the blessings God has given through his Son Jesus Christ our Savior.

"Leaping" ahead, let's take a peek at what is coming. Some events are in the planning stages and others are already full steam ahead. First, we are going to celebrate John Schneider's 100th birthday on Sunday February 9th. What an incredible milestone. Please make sure you mark your calendar so you don't miss out on this special occasion. Cake and chicken will be provided along with side dishes from our members following worship service. Cards and birthday wishes are welcome. February 16th is another Soup Sunday and fellowship on February 23rd, we will have a special Mardi Gras theme.

March 1st starts another Search & Discovery class which will hopefully end with welcoming new members on March 29th. Another Information Sunday is being planned for March but the date and details are still in the planning stages. March 15th is pancake Sunday and another Soup Sunday will also be held on March 29th.

Preparations are already underway for Easter services. We are planning on a Seder dinner along with a guest speaker from The Chosen People organization on Maundy Thursday April 9th. This will be in lieu of our normal Maundy Thursday worship service. Details will be provided about this event once the planning has been finalized. Prayers at the Cross will be on Friday April 10th from noon until 7:00p.m. Easter Sunday, April 12th, will start with our annual Easter Breakfast followed by an Easter worship service. The PADS program will end on April 13th and April 19th marks the start of setting up for the spring Rummage and Bake Sale, which will be held on April 24th and 25th. And that takes us through the first quarter of 2020!!!

Along with all these plans and events, we are still working on raising the funds needed to pay for our much needed new roof. Many generous donations have already been received and we are closing the gap to reach the \$37,000 needed to pay for the cost of this major renovation. However, we are still in need of about \$6,000 to meet that end goal. So if you can, please take a shingle from our "church roof" located in the Narthex and make a donation which will be greatly appreciated. The overall physical work plan is on schedule and we should be underway in March if weather permits. More details on what to expect during the renovation will be provided once we have the final plans in place. As a side note, once we have the funds for the roof, we will still need to raise another \$10,000 to purchase the new projector.

I hope that this overview of what's to come confirms for you that the YCUCC is filled with vitality and a love of doing Christ's work. May you embrace the knowledge that a "Leap of Faith" will give you everlasting nourishment throughout your life's journey.

This has been one crazy winter. We had snow for Halloween and the kids made snowmen with pumpkin heads and the day before Christmas the kids were outside drawing with chalk on the sidewalks.

Bob Bazan who has been plowing our parking lot stopped in the other day to let us know that he would no longer be able to take care of us after this winter. His truck is getting too old. Bob followed his brother Steve Bazan in

taking care of our parking lot. It will feel strange not to have a Bazan plowing us. Bob's truck did die while clearing our parking lot so we have been accepting bids for a new provider for this service. Hopefully we will find a company quickly without interruption of our service.

The B & G team of men have been busy finishing up projects. They have installed an exterior mailbox by the main entrance door to our church. Having an exterior mailbox prevents us from having interrupted mail delivery when we are closed. This means that we now have to take outgoing mail to the post office to be mailed ourselves. The B & G men also installed acrylic panels to protect the lower part of the stained-glass windows in Fellowship Hall. There has been some damage done in the past to the windows which we have not had the funds to repair (quote \$10,000). Hopefully these acrylic panels will prevent further damage.

Dan Brain is serving us on Sunday mornings as a safety guard. He checks to see that the exterior side doors are locked during the worship service and walks the halls to see that all the kids are safe in their various areas. Mr. Dan, as the kids call him, is helping to keep our kids safe. It is very comforting to know that he has taken his role seriously and is helping us to keep our children safe while in our building.

We are about six weeks out from starting our Slope Roof Replacement. The start date depends on the weather. Soon you will see the materials and the dumpster waiting. Thank you for your generous support for this huge project. We have learned a lot about the construction of our roof and feel we have selected a great company to make the improvements and to do the installation.




