

Howard Thurman was a 20th Century giant of thought and faith. The grandchild of a former enslaved person and raised by a single mother, he rose from the segregated South to become one of the leading academics and authors of his time.

This poem is in Thurman's *The Mood of Christmas and Other Celebrations*.

The Work of Christmas

Howard Thurman

When the song of the angels is stilled,
When the star in the sky is gone,
When the kings and princes are home,
When the shepherds are back with their flock,
The work of Christmas begins:
To find the lost,
To heal the broken,
To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoner,
To rebuild the nations,
To bring peace among others,

To make music in the heart.




Join in Remembrance Sunday, January 17, 10 a.m. Worship


