At the time of writing this, our region is under phase 4 tier 1 resurgence mitigations.

Simply put, I feel that it is our duty to do what we are able to do to get COVID under control. I hope and pray that this policy is met with grace, understanding and possibly even agreement.

We are moving forward! With Pam Hamblin's guidance and the help of Laurie Strong, the Building and Grounds men carefully put away the Christmas decorations for another year.

The committee is working to obtain bids for replacing the flat roof. We thought we could wait a few years, but we continue to have leaks in the building, and we are continuously chasing water leaks.



We did a sample area with the new flat roof material where we no longer need to have river rock as a ballast on the roof about 6 months ago. We agree with the finance and SLT committees that we need to do a one-time full flat roof replacement by late spring or early summer. A special group of leaders are looking to see how to finance this project and what maintenance needs to be done to keep the roofs in good repair to last their expected years of warranty coverage. Formal bids are being obtained by the Building and Grounds members and they are interviewing the contractors.

We received a letter from Steven Redmond resigning as a Sexton effective March first. We want to thank Steven for his years of service. He was thorough with his nightly checks and handled emergencies when they occurred well, and communicated what he discovered in a note or text message.

Phillip Bethke will continue as our only sexton for the next few months.

Church programs do continue during COVID-19 under restricted guidelines. If your committee is meeting by Zoom or conference calling, please let us share your group information on our church calendar so that church members know that programing is continuing.

## A Love Story from the Bible

### What happens?

Ruth, a widow and full-time care giver of her mother-in-law, Naomi, took up work with Naomi's relative, Boaz. Ruth providing for the mother of her deceased husband was seen as noble by Boaz, and he looked upon her favorably – despite the fact she was a "foreigner". Boaz cared for Ruth and sent her to work in a field full of young women to ensure that the young men did not assault her.

Ruth sleeps with Boaz (no hanky-panky) and is told that, should she not find a "redeemer" that Boaz himself will "redeem" her. A potential redeemer comes, but is put off when Boaz tells that Ruth is part of the deal; apparently he was only after the land and not a woman on the side. Therefore, Boaz takes Ruth as his wife and with it inherits her land – thus keeping it in the family.

### What does this show us about love?

Boaz has Ruth's best interests at heart and does all he can to ensure that she remains safe. Indicating that true love is about protecting, caring, and supporting for the one that you love.
