Prayer makes us healthier—relieves stress, increases focus, and helps us live a longer, happier life. Dr. Herbert Benson, at Harvard Medical School found that prayer decreases metabolism, slows the heart rate, reduces blood pressure and we become

calmer. Prayer boosts the immune system and can help us recover from illness quicker according to a University of Cincinnati study. University of Pennsylvania found that prayer increases our sense of well-being and joy.

Prayer seems a splendid antidote in the grip of a pandemic winter of snows and cold. Prayer can soothe the strains that hold us back from joy, ease the isolation of loneliness and connect us to the divine presence in our lives.

Consider giving a gift of coffee and give back to the church at the same time.








E-Giving is Easy!

Our men are getting tired of chasing water to find where the leaks are originating. We are reviewing proposals and looking at a better way to improve the water flow off of the flat roof in hopes of correcting the areas that have been major leak areas in the past. Our goal is to have a recommendation to the SLT and the congregation so that the work can be done this summer.




