



TIM's TALES

Here is an update on the interim process and a challenge.

Update: The Heritage Celebrations: During the 9 meetings with 36 participants identified 4 clear themes.


- 1. Friendly is the first impression most people have of YCUCC. First time visitors chose to stay because they were approached by a friendly lay person who was present in a positive manner with the visitor and engaged that visitor with a genuine welcome. Quote: "Not you getting into the church, but the church getting into you."
 Two sub themes emerged, people with young children desired quality family programing and many people first engaged with YCUCC because they identified with the UCC or a specific mission of the UCC (Open & Affirming, social justice).
- 2. **Music** ministries are core to the YCUCC experience. Most participants appreciated the "classic" form of worship music and expressed an openness to "newer" worship music. Highly valued were the music programs for children and youth.
- 3. **Fellowship Groups** such as Reel People, Stephen Ministry, Joy Circle, The Green Group, and events such as the rummage sales, spaghetti dinners, soup suppers, etcetera were valued for their fellowship and service opportunities. These events helped form a common bond of mission and purpose among participants.
- 4. **Community Service** opportunities in impactful social justice ministries helped build identity and purpose in the church. Quote: "Service is in the DNA of the church."

Challenge: Imagine the Future: You can engage in workshops linking the Holy Spirit to the church's current strengths and then begin to imagine the church's future. There will be five workshops—two in person and three video conferences. Make sure your voice is heard by participating. From the Desk of the Chair

As many of you know, our current flat roof has served us well, however, just like any major piece of equipment, it has come to the end of its useful life. The roof leaks in multiple locations and is leaving us exposed to the possibility of damage inside. We need a new flat roof.

The good news is that we do have the money for the project in the bank. However, just like when we have large bills in our personal lives, if we can pay for it without raiding our savings account, that is the best option.

Yes, this project is expensive. It's a big roof. The total cost is nearly \$150,000. This is our first challenge.

However, the second, and most important challenge, is this. The church is currently spending more than we, as a community, are providing through our gifts. This has been true for several years. We have been bridging the gap using the same savings account that we also need to pay for the roof, and we can only use those dollars once.

Yes, we need to live within our means, but we are running out of expenses to cut. We need to increase income by 10% which is approximately \$30,000 per year.

Don't let the big numbers scare you. This boils down to about \$50 per month, per family.

We are all in different positions relative to how much we can give. Some are stretched as far as they can go. Many of us, if not <u>most</u> of us, can dig deeper now that we know our story. We're in this together. We need to take care of this building because this building houses our ministries.

If our income rises to meet our expenses, we'll be fine! But it is an absolute necessity that this happens.

If your number isn't \$50 per month, or \$100 per month, what is it?

No One Can Do Everything, but Everyone Can Do Something.

Please prayerfully consider two questions: "What can you do?" and "What will you do?"

I want to thank the SLT members for their vote accepting the recommendation from the Building and Grounds Committee. Their vote acknowledged that the B & G had done their due diligence and selected the best company to install the new flat roof.

We now have the same roofing company that installed both the shingle and the flat roofs. With their help we have a new design to extend the life of the shingle pitch roof and now a new design to change the water flow off of the flat roof. The warranty for the flat roof will provide us 20 years "No Dollar Limit" labor and material backed by the manufacturer.

We will keep you informed on when this project will begin and what safety measures will be in place during the installation.

With spring here and long daylight and more sunshine we are looking forward to addressing some outside projects. The men cleaned and added a new plexiglass to the door that projects the movable lettering on the corner sign. We also needed to replace the lock to keep kids from rearranging the letters on the sign.

Yard clean up needs to begin. If we need to schedule a yard clean up day, we will reach out to our church family for more help.

We also plan to add stone to the south parking lot and Bill Anderson has offered to help with this project.

Please continue to share meeting and other active information with us to make sure that it is on the church calendar. We do our best to keep the google calendar up to date with information of upcoming events.

Do you have an apartment to rent?




The men and women, who have been living year-round in poor, unstable conditions, currently are receiving assistance from Community Action in the Kendall County Health Department. Apartments, one bedroom or two bedrooms in or near Kendall County, are very much needed.

Landlords can receive guaranteed rent payments every month with costs being covered partially or fully with housing vouchers.



I am excited to announce the last book we will be reading this academic year! *The Devil's High: A True Story* by Luis Alberto Urrea. It is a brilliantly written book that is both horrifying and eye opening! Goodreads says, "In this work of grave beauty and searing power - one of the most widely praised pieces of investigative reporting to appear in recent years - we follow twenty-six men who in May 2001 attempted to cross the Mexican border into the desert of southern Arizona, through the deadly region known as the Devil's Highway, a desert so harsh and desolate that even the Border Patrol is afraid to travel through it, a place that for hundreds of years has stolen men's souls and swallowed their blood. Only twelve men made it out."


For Further Reading:


