The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen." – Luke 24:5 (NRSV)

After twelve months of this pandemic, if our greatest desire is to get back to where we were a year ago, we have missed the memo from the Holy Spirit.

The women get the news when they are looking for Jesus' body in the empty tomb. "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" Why do you look backwards for God's future?

If all you want is a sentimental sign of spring, I'm sure you can find a crocus growing in a graveyard somewhere, but the promise of new life is more than that.

What is dead is gone because it has been transformed into something entirely new. So much so that after the resurrection, when Jesus ran into his closest friends, they did not recognize him. They were looking for the living among the dead. They were massaging their memories, clutching to sacred scrapbooks from a pretend past, the kind that grows more perfect the further we are from it. When Jesus actually showed up on the street where they lived, they almost missed him.

New life does not mean more of the same. So why settle for some pre-pandemic nostalgic normalcy for your church, your children, your institutions, your society, your schools, or your street? Why do you look for the living among the dead?

Resurrection is the radical change that renders our run-of-the-mill desires unrecognizable. Christ is risen and there's no going back.

Underwood Announces FEMA Funeral Assistance Now Available to Illinoisans Who Have Lost Loved Ones Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic

Underwood Helped Secure Additional Funding for FEMA through the American Rescue Plan

West Chicago—Today, Congresswoman Lauren Underwood (IL-14) announced new financial assistance available to Illinoisans through the American Rescue Plan. As of April 12, 2021, FEMA is accepting applications to help pay for funeral expenses incurred after Jan. 20, 2020, for deaths related to COVID-19 to help Illinois families who have been financially burdened during the pandemic. In December 2020, Underwood supported the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act that provided \$2 billion in federal resources for funeral assistance through FEMA. Underwood championed additional resources in the American Rescue Plan to support this critical program. This assistance is limited to a maximum financial amount of \$9,000 per funeral and a maximum of \$35,500 per application.

“Across northern Illinois, many of our neighbors have lost family members, friends, and loved ones due to COVID-19. To support Illinois families, I championed resources in the American Rescue Plan that are now available to help ease the financial burden of funeral expenses. If you are eligible to receive assistance through FEMA, I encourage you to apply today,” said Rep. Underwood.

Illinoisans can visit <https://www.fema.gov/disasters/coronavirus/economic/funeral-assistance> to learn how to apply.

To be eligible for funeral assistance, you must meet these conditions:

- The death must have occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- The death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to COVID-19.
- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen or qualified noncitizens who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020.
- There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen or qualified noncitizen.

Spring is a busy time for the building and grounds team of men. First, our flat roof replacement is scheduled to begin May 10th. Then it's time for yard work and garden clean up for the summer. This team of men meet every Tuesday morning at 9:00 a.m. to review projects and to plan what needs to happen next. If you would like to join the Building and Grounds committee you are welcome to come any Tuesday.

Once the roof is done, the men plan to finish painting the front northwest corner. They want to correct the drainage in the front gardens so that the water drains away from the building. We have two windows to install on the west side of the building: one in the Christian Education office and one in the Alpha/Omega youth room. Over the next five years we still have ten windows to replace. We try to replace two a year.

This is the season for trimming bushes and trees. We will give the date and time for a Saturday Workday. We can always use more hands. Weeding is always needed. If you can give a hand for an hour or more, please do. The garden in the back is huge and is beautiful when kept up.

We are excited for the flat roof replacement to begin! The new material and design should help us be leak proof for many years. Donations to help with this expense are always welcomed.

Adult Education: Why read books?



Books, thus far, have been my focus for adult education. So, why books?

1. We all lead terribly busy, active lives and a monthly or semi-monthly class is a **small commitment** most of us can squeeze in.
2. Books take a **deep dive** into a subject. There are a lot of videos and social media posts about anything and everything, but these just skim the surface. To really understand a topic, one needs to spend much more time learning and thinking, books are perfect for this.
3. **Book discussion groups** are wonderful for understanding an issue and other people. You hear perspectives you yourself never thought of, you understand other people's perspectives, and come away from the discussion with a deeper understanding of the issue and the people in your group.

A lot of people say that they are just too busy to read. Here are my tips to squeeze in more reading time.

1. **Bring your book with you** wherever you go. It is amazing how much reading I can get in while waiting to pick-up Trevor from band or waiting at the doctor's office.
2. **Carve out 20 min of reading time in your day.** Elementary school kids are required to read 20 min a day, set a good example, set a timer, and sit down with them and read.
3. **Put your phone down.** It is amazing to me how much time can go by when I just mean to look at my phone for a few minutes.
4. **Try audio books** if you have long commutes or take long walks. I put my wireless headphones on and listen while I am folding laundry and doing dishes. These are often available at the Yorkville Public Library.

“Why is it called Stephen Ministry?”

Stephen Ministry’s namesake—Stephen, was one of the first laypeople commissioned by the apostles to care for the community of believers in Acts 6.

Just as Stephen helped to meet the growing needs of the early church, Stephen Ministry expands the caring capacity of congregations. And just as Stephen shared the spirit of Jesus, so Stephen Ministry brings Christ’s healing love to those who are hurting.

That’s where Stephen Ministry gets its name, and that’s what it’s all about—carrying on the spirit of Stephen.

The Relationship between STEWARDSHIP and MISSION

The word “mission” basically means an errand, and assignment. Christian mission is what God has sent us to do, our commission from Jesus Christ. The mission of the church is its stewardship of the world. Douglas John Hall has described the church as ‘a community that cares for the world ... for *its* welfare, *its* justice, *its* peace, *its* survival”.

While the word “stewardship” means the carrying out of an assignment, Christian stewardship “does not describe any one dimension of the Christian life, it describes the whole posture called ‘Christian’, according to Hall. **Stewardship is the church’s mission.** It is through *being stewards* that the church’s mission is possible. It is through *being stewards* that we faithfully and responsibly care for God’s creation, enlisting and creatively using all of the resources entrusted to us by God. It is through *being stewards* that we respond to Jesus’ commission.

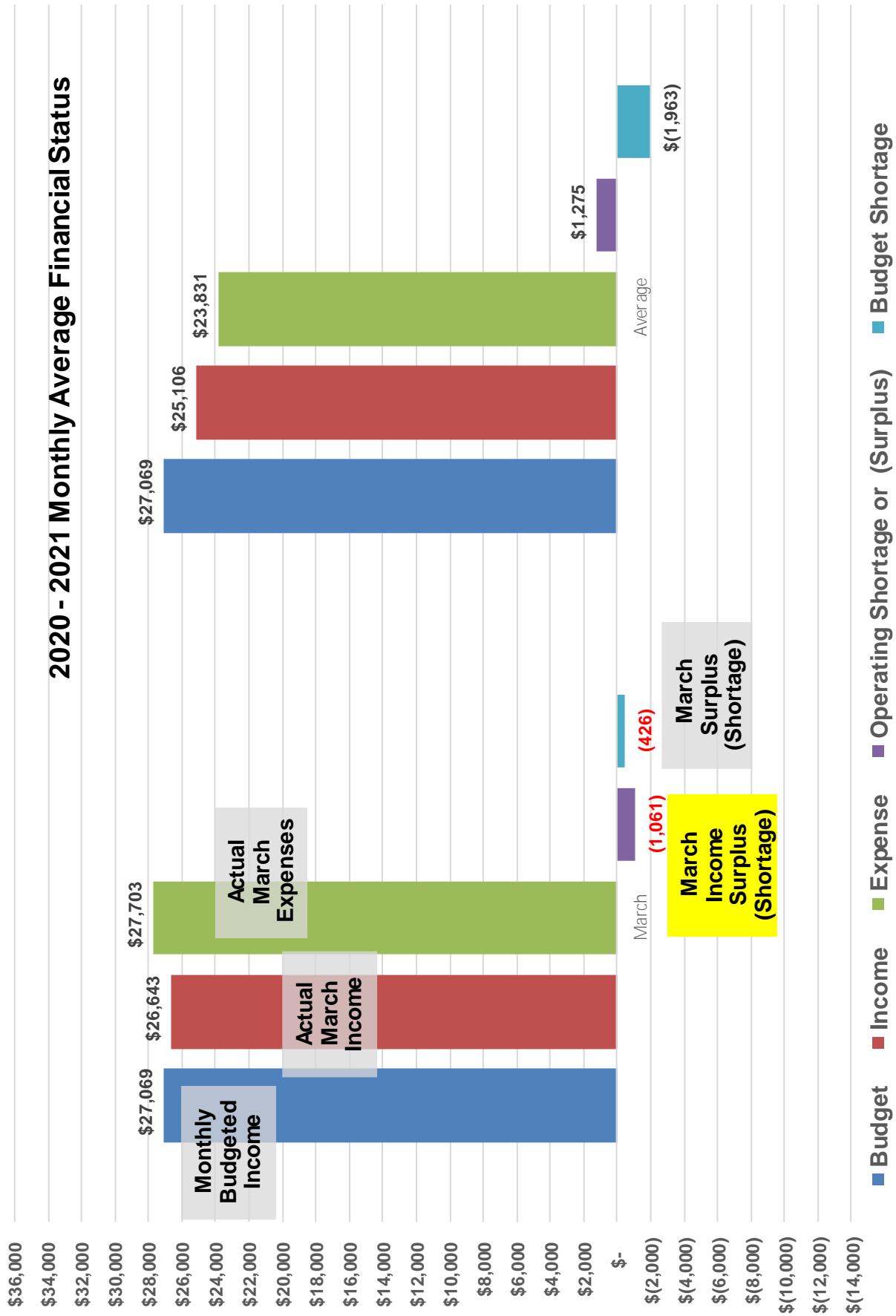
