





TIM's TALES

Congregational renewal takes many forms. In Lawrence, Kansas, it meant forming meaningful relationships to support students affected by the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Plymouth Congregational Church in Lawrence, Kansas, partnered with the Haskell Foundation whose sole mission is to support Haskell Indian Nations University. Covid-19 deeply affected Indigenous people and the students and staff of Haskell suffered hardships during the pandemic. One Navajo student received help for an emergency flight and quarantine accommodations because he needed to return to bury five family members.

Plymouth continued to aid students throughout the year. Sara Taliaferro, of Plymouth, explained, "One young Lakota woman traveled back from her reservation to off-campus housing in Lawrence, KS, last September. Her car broke down on the way. She had managed to scrape together the first month's rent and deposit for the off-campus apartment. But she had to spend her rent money on car repairs. Emergency funds helped her make the rent deposit, so she had a place to live when she got back here."

Drawing on her 25-years of work with people experiencing homelessness and housing insecurity, Sara knew, "complex community problems can't be fixed with a simple checklist of actions." Instead, the congregation focused on developing meaningful community relationships on the Haskell campus. Sara worked closely with Manny King a Northern Cheyenne native and university counselor. Even as they help specific students, Sara and Manny build the kind of community solidarity that affects lasting change.

YCUCC is currently gathering the Strengthen the Church Offering which provides crucial support to congregations and their community partners during the Covid Pandemic. Beyond the pandemic, grants from the Strengthen the Church offering will help congregations pivot towards church renewal and community engagement.

The Building and Grounds team has done it again! CE Director proposed the idea of setting up a 'Gaga ball' court on the church grounds and in the blink of an eye, the Building and Grounds team had the court up and ready for play!

For those of you that are unfamiliar with 'gaga ball', it is a variant of dodgeball and is played in a 'gaga pit' with a single rubber ball. The game combines jumping, running and dodging a ball. The object is to be the last player hit. The pit is octagonal in shape and built with wood; it stands about two feet high and is generally 8 or 10 feet in length.

The new 'gaga pit' is a great addition to our children's programming and a clear sign to the community that YCUCC is a church that loves and ministers to children.

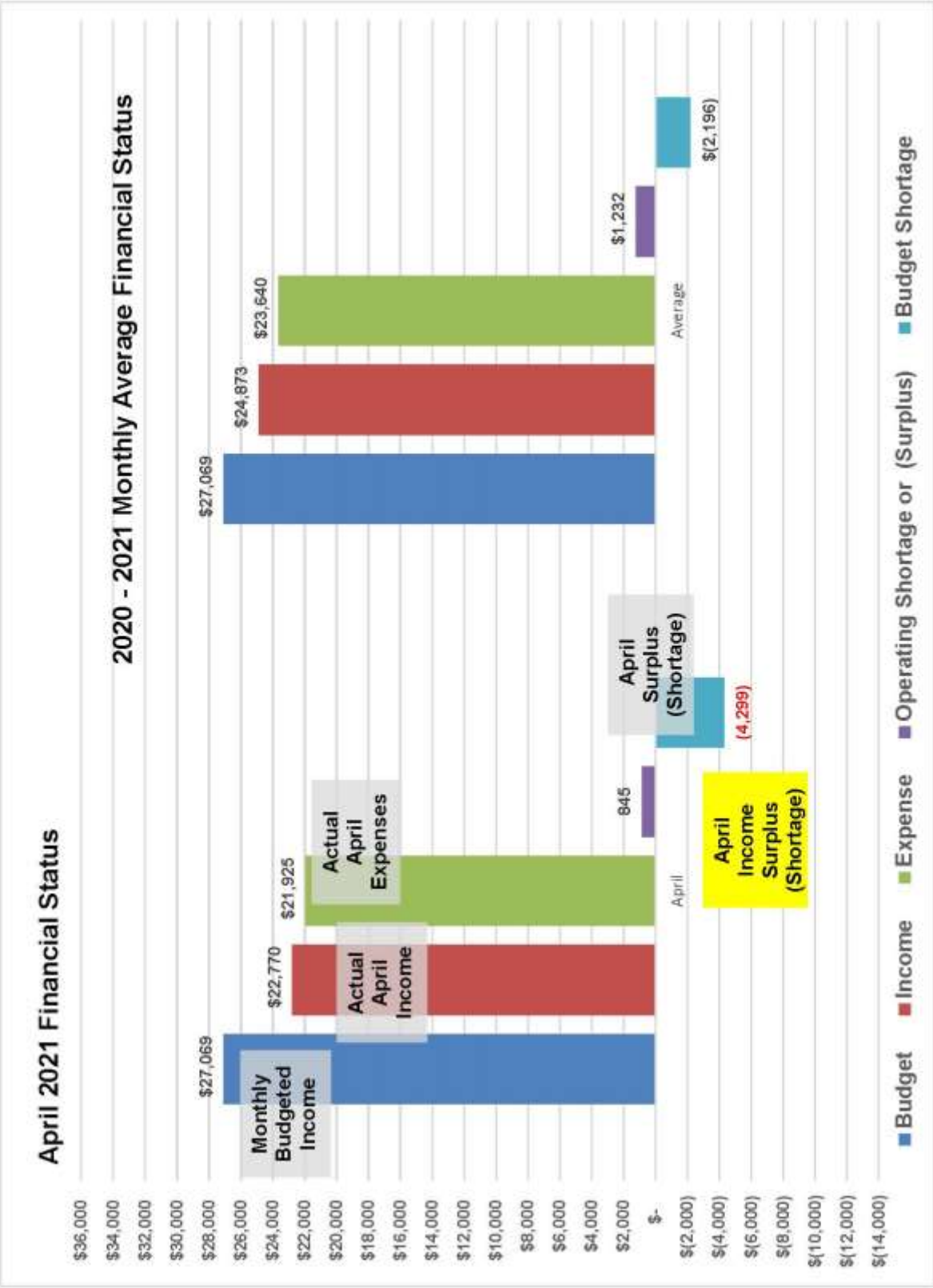
