

# TIM's TALES

As the Search Committee begins its good and faithful work you might be wondering how you might best help them find the next pastor for Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ. I have a suggestion. But first....

Serving on a Search Committee is a great privilege. And it is hard work. The work will keep committee members from their families. The work will cause disagreement and discord among the members. Each search committee member will work long hours as they form the group, write the church's profile, read pastoral profiles, try to listen to God, and interview candidates. The search process also requires faithfully working together for a common purpose of serving the church.

So, how can you help? Pray for the Search Committee. Let me suggest five guides to your prayers for the committee.

- 1. Unity. The committee members will disagree, sometimes strongly. They will need to decide which of the church's priorities are negotiable and which are not. Some will like one kind of sermon and others will like another. Some will like a particular candidate and others will not. Unity is essential. Please pray with me that the committee will have unity of purpose.
- 2. Spiritual Strength. Service on a search committee will always stretch a person's faith. There will be fresh spiritual learnings and differing ideas about how a church can faithfully serve God. The committee has already appointed a chaplain to keep them centered on God. Prayer within the committee and prayer for the committee is essential. Please pray with me that the committee will hold to a spiritual center amid the many family distractions, personal challenges, and common hardships they may face in their time of service.
- 3. Wisdom. We pray that the whole committee may be empowered by the wisdom of God. Myriad choices will entangle the committee from what should the pastor's greatest strength be, what age, what gender, how biblically strong, how strong a singer, where will the pastor live and on and on and on. God's wisdom is the best guide through this thicket. Please pray with me that God's wisdom will guide the committee.
- 4. Fortitude. The search process needs the time to let the Holy Spirit work. Some in the congregation will grow weary of waiting and the committee will become weary from the work. God will give them the fortitude they need. We must give them the room they need. Please pray with me that the committee will have the fortitude to endure the process.
- 5. Fun. Fun can be had. Self-deprecating laughter, goofy gags, and just plain silliness can help the committee focus and delight in faithful frivolity. Pray with me that the committee may have buckets of fun.

Want to help the search committee? Pray that they may have unity, spiritual strength, wisdom, fortitude, and fun. And when you feel stuck simply pray, "May God guide them. Amen."





# From the Desk of the Chair

From the middle of June and extending through July we have the opportunity to celebrate our independence. Juneteenth, now a federal holiday, celebrated the independence and freedom from the shackles of slavery of over an eighth of the entire population of the United States. That reminds me of something I recently heard... "No One Truly Wins Until We All Win!" - Rev. Timothy C. Rhodes

We also get to celebrate the 4th of July to mark our countries independence. The Yorkville parade and celebration is a good chance for our church to get out into the community and we plan to take advantage of it through participation in the parade and staffing the bounce house attraction at the park. Thanks to Lori Redmon, Kathy Farren, Barb Thurlby, Mary Ellen Anderson and many others for organizing the strong showing our church will have at this July 3rd community event. We hope you can participate and attend.

Both of these celebrations are made sweeter by the fact that Illinois entered "Phase 5" of its COVID-19 reopening plan on June 11th. This comes with a significant removal of restrictions regarding social distancing, masks and capacity limitations. Our church has moved in accordance with this plan and, starting with the June 27th worship service, removed capacity limitations and relaxed mask requirements to be optional in alignment with CDC guidance. There is no change to the children's programs and nursery staff and masks will still be required in those settings. You should start to see a steady increase in "normal" church activity as we progress through the remainder of the year.

In other news, our flat roof replacement project is under way. This will be a huge improvement and solution to the many leaks that we have had in our church over recent years. This project comes with a price tag that puts significant pressure on the church's finances. In March I announced that we needed an increase in monthly giving of \$50 per family if we are to meet our ongoing expenses. The latest data shows that we have seen 21 increases of \$50 or more out of 109 families and we need more. Now is the time to act! Please consider increasing your regular giving to support the ongoing work of your church.

# **'KNIGHTS OF NORTH CASTLE' VBS IS COMING!!**



He set my feet on solid ground and steadied me as I walked along, HE has given us a new song to sing, a hymn of praise to our GOD – Psalm 40 2b-3.







# Join the E-Giving Automatic Giving Plan!

Many people give regularly to support the congregation. Members are continuously seeking out alternative payment options to simplify their busy lives. Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ has an automatic giving plan.
