TIM's TALES

"But you, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness." Psalm 86:15

While checking his bags at the airport, a man became indignant with the employee who checked his luggage. For several minutes he belittled the young worker and criticized his every move. Surprisingly, the worker didn't seem troubled by the man's verbal abuse. After the angry man walked away, a woman approached the worker and asked, "How do you put up with such foolishness?" The young man said, "It's easy. That guy's going to New York, but I'm sending his bags to Brazil."

I've often seen angry people in airports. The anger seems foolish to me. People who yell at TSA agents almost always miss their flights. And I wonder what angry people think the gate agent can do about the delayed flight? I once saw a woman yell at a pilot about the weather. Now I see videos documenting fist fights in planes. Which combatant thinks the fight will end well?

Refrain from anger and forsake wrath. Do not fret—it leads only to evil. Psalm 37:8

Jesus got angry. The filching of the poor, the denial of care due to pietistic platitudes, and the sale of indulgences all enraged Jesus. Anger can be a holy tool. People of faith are justifiably angry about injustice and use that anger to spur action.

Missing a flight is not an injustice. Wearing a mask to protect the health of others is not an injustice, but a service to the neighbor. Learning to live among people with whom we disagree is a kindness that builds a gracious community.

And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Colossians 3:15

From the Desk of the Chair

I hope you are all enjoying the summer. My family and I have been taking many opportunities to get out of the house after having been sequestered to our home for long enough. It seems like most people are. People are travelling more and attending more gatherings and events. Our church is open and peoples' smiles are out. It has been wonderful and energizing to see everyone and just be together.

As I celebrate this expansion of the accessible world, I am doing so with caution. New variants of COVID are blooming and may not peak until well into the fall. Our children are going back to school this month. I pray that school officials and leaders have the wisdom and bravery to craft a safe environment for our children.

We are all interconnected. We all have our rights and freedoms; however, we have to balance that with the fact that our choices can negatively affect the rights and freedoms of others. Reasoning through this is made especially difficult when the consequences of our choices are delayed or far away, and the connections are complex or invisible. For most of us, a simple mental simulation and discussion with a friend cannot predict the impact our actions have on others for things as complicated as COVID or climate change for example. This is why we follow the science and guidance from institutions whose sole purpose is to know better than us.

Your church leadership is continually keeping a lookout for changes we may need to react to. We make incremental changes slowly when reopening and follow CDC and IDPH guidance. Vaccinations have been shown to be extremely effective which is why we adjusted to make masks optional for the vaccinated. Children under the age of 12 are not eligible for the vaccination which is why we continue to require masks for all youth programs. We have a simple strategy. We follow the guidance of those that know better than us.

Take advantage of the freedoms and joys of life, the warmth of summer, and the company of friends and family, but do so with a balanced approach, recognizing that we live our lives intertwined with many, many, others. Be part of the solution. Love your neighbor.

Rush-Copley Chaplain to discuss Advance Directives



On Sunday August 8th, Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ will welcome Reverend Daniel J. Sullivan, Chaplain/Director of Spiritual Care at Rush/Copley Medical Center. He will lead worship service at 10 a.m. Following worship, Rev Sullivan will be discussing the meaning and importance of Advance Directives.

Reverend Sullivan serves Rush-Copley as Co-Chairperson of the Medical Ethics Committee, a member of the Rush Copley Institutional Review Board, a lecturer for the Family Practice Residency Program and past Coordinator of Emergency Preparedness. He holds BA and MA degrees from College of St. Thomas, St. Paul, Minnesota, and a Master of Divinity degree from St. Thomas Theological Seminary, Denver, Colorado. He completed residency in clinical Pastoral Education at Rush-Presbyterian-St. Luke's Medical Center, Chicago. Prior to his work as chaplain at Rush-Copley, he served as Associate Pastor of St. Mary's Catholic Parish in Downers Grove. He is Chaplain of the Westmont Fire Department was a firefighter/paramedic for 28 years in Downers Grove and Westmont. He is a frequent lecturer on the subject of Advance Directives.

Advance Directives is defined as a legal document signed by a living person in order to provide guidance for medical and health-care decisions in the event that the person becomes incompetent to make such decisions.

Rev. Sullivan will address the importance of an Advance Directive, the tools available to assist in communicating wishes for the future, and how to appoint a decision maker to speak for you, should you become unable to do so due to illness or injury.

YCUCC Collects Two Carloads of Polystyrene

Polystyrene products filled two vehicles after just five weeks of collection at YCUCC. Members and friends of YCUCC in the month of June brought in Polystyrene (Styrofoam) packaging products and food service products and put them into a large collection box in the vestibule. Green Group members took the polystyrene to DART Container company in North Aurora.

The foam products will be re-made into other products by selling it to manufacturers of picture frames, interior molding, pens, rulers and foam packaging. The old products which are "taken back" by the company are remade into similar products.

The #6 plastic, like all other plastics, is harmful to our environment - air, soil, and water. And, yes, some waste and cost occurs in the recycling process; however, the foam products are being diverted from landfills, streams, and air.

All people are encouraged to collect polystyrene (#6) and make your own drop off at DART - any day, 24/7, into the large bins on 310 Evergreen Drive, North Aurora. Go to the DART website to learn more about the recycling company and to get directions to their collection site.

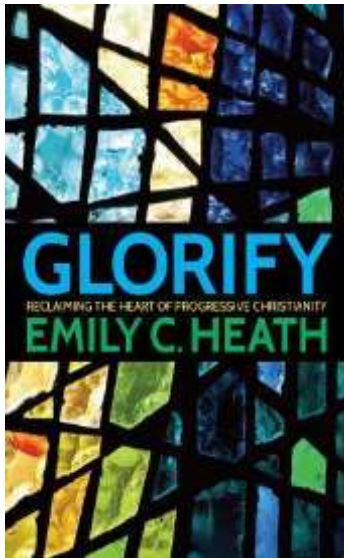

Glorify: Reclaiming The Heart Of Progressive Christianity by Emily C. Heath, United Church of Christ minister and Senior Pastor of the Congregational Church in Exeter, New Hampshire.

In this excellent, short book Rev. Heath states that Progressive Christians often neglect the foundations of their faith to focus on helping others. She makes the case that Progressive Christians first need to focus on their own discipleship. "It's time for Progressive Christians to claim discipleship. It's time to get radical, not about politics or our policies, but about our faith...it's time to see our social justice work as a natural product of our discipleship, not something that competes with it for the church's time."

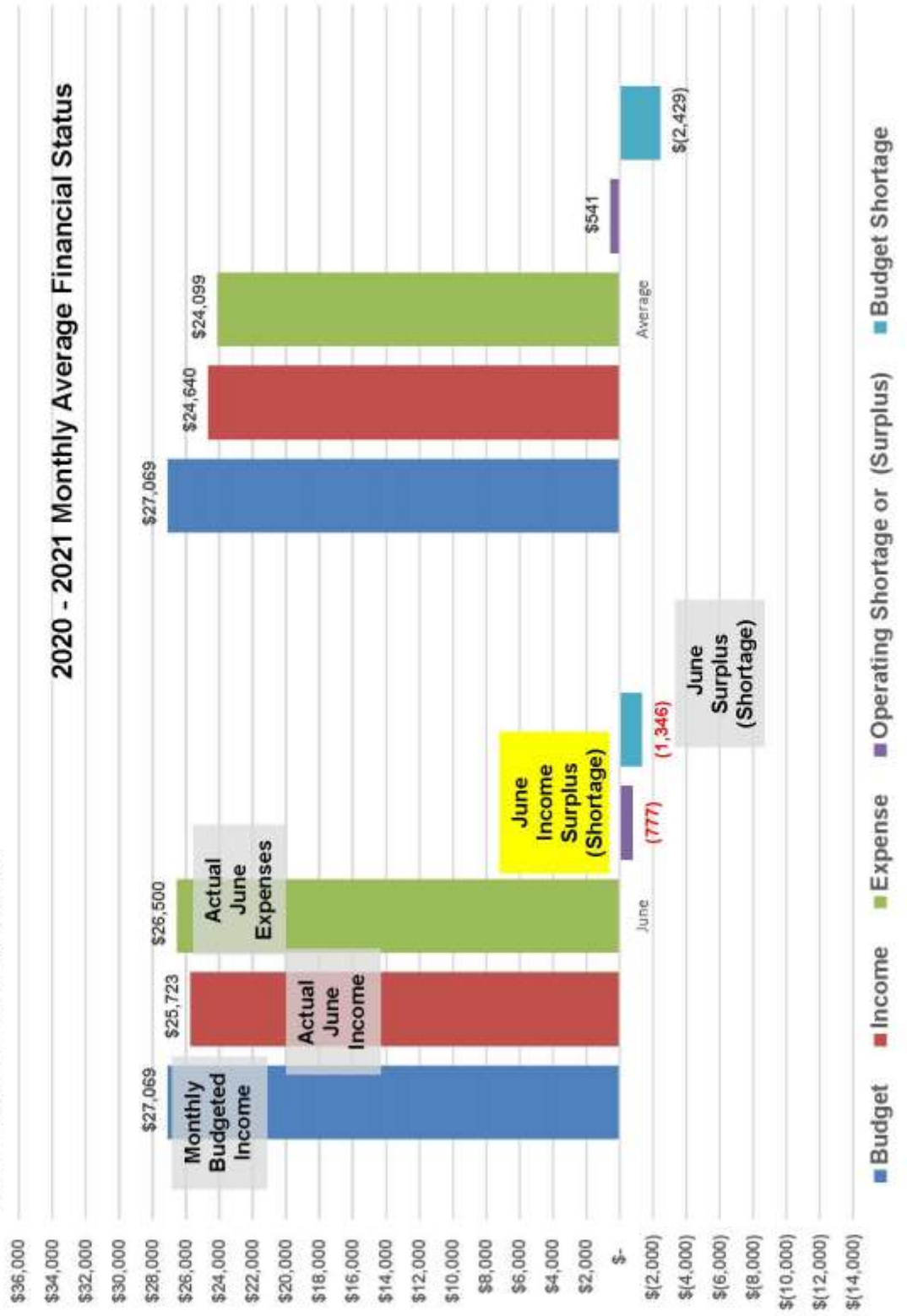

Many people give regularly to support the congregation. Members are continuously seeking out alternative payment options to simplify their busy lives. Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ has an automatic giving plan.

Instead of writing a check each week or month, your gifts can be automatically deducted from your checking or savings account weekly or monthly. Your account can be with any bank within the United States.

How it works:

- The first step is to fill out, sign and return the authorization form.
