




#### **Book Review**




Infinite Country by Patricia Engel

This excellent book was written by Patricia Engel, an award winning author; she is a dual citizen and the daughter of Colombian immigrants. The book follows a family from Bogotá, Colombia as they attempt to make a new life in the United States. The family struggles to get by, is separated, and has to grapple with feelings of not belonging anywhere. The writing is both minimalist and lush, full of Andean myth and legend. This short book (just 191 pages) is definitely worth reading! It was a March 2021 Reese's book club pick. # YCUCC's 2021 Fall Rummage & Bake Sale has been canceled!

J.O.Y. Circle elected to wait until spring 2022 to host the next rummage & bake sale.

- ➤ We have been closely following CDC and IDPH guidelines, plus the Kendall County COVID-19 Risk Tracker regarding COVID-19/Delta variant, which quickly moved from Substantial > High Risk > Very High as of August 25<sup>th</sup>!
- The number of Kendall County residents to become infected with COVID-19 continues to steadily rise. In its weekly report issued Thursday, August 19, Kendall County Health Department reported 245 new COVID-19 cases and the test positivity rate for the virus among county residents increased to 9.1%, up from 8.8% reported August 12. Although the Vulnerability Level is low, Kendall County COVID-19 Risk Tracker updates for August 25 report Daily New Cases Per 100k is 27.1, Infection Rate is 1.03, Positive Test Rate is 11.0%, % Vaccinated is 69.1% 1+ dose.

Safety 1st for all involved is our main concern!! We do not want to put any volunteers or customers at risk due to continued health concerns regarding COVID-19/Delta variant.

If you are willing to save items you planned to donate to this fall's sale for the 2022 Spring R&B Sale scheduled for April 29<sup>th</sup> & 30<sup>th</sup>, we thank you very much!!

#### OMEGA YOUTH GROUP STUDENTS LEAD THE BEAT



# In Memory of Rev. Robert (Bob) Stout

(February 4, 1936 - September 12, 2020

Bob was born in Caseyville, IL, the second child of Glenn and Elsie (Ohl) Stout. The family would ultimately make their home in rural Belleville, IL, where Bob met and married (1959) his high school sweetheart, Elizabeth Anne (Ibby) Thorne. He graduated from Southern Illinois University (BA in History), enrolled at Eden Theological Seminary, and was ordained into the Christian Ministry (United Church of Christ) in 1963, serving congregations in Missouri, Illinois, Pennsylvania, and Minnesota. From 1976 to 1992 he was a program coordinator for Seminars International, retiring from called ministry in 2003. He was then certified as an Interim Minister, serving UCC congregations in transition in Illinois, and fully retired in 2016. He is survived by his sister Glenna Meyers, his beloved wife, Elizabeth, three sons, Mark, Michael (Stephanie), and Matthew (Amy), and three grandchildren, Kaitlyn (Ivan Lopez-Garcia), Andrew and Jackson.



# Join the E-Giving Automatic Giving Plan!

Many people give regularly to support the congregation. Members are continuously seeking out alternative payment options to simplify their busy lives. Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ has an automatic giving plan.

Instead of writing a check each week or month, your gifts can be automatically deducted from your checking or savings account weekly or monthly. Your account can be with any bank within the United States.

#### How it works:

- The first step is to fill out, sign and return the authorization form.
- Then, each week or month, we will debit your account through the Federal Reserve's Automated Clearing House (ACH). This is a simple way for us to electronically transfer dollars from your account to the Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ church's account in one simple step.
- When you receive your bank statement each month, you will see a line item referencing this transaction along with the dollar amount you've specified. We will also keep track of your gifts and each transaction will show up as a line item on your yearly giving statement.
