COVID Update

The position that YCUCC leadership has taken from the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic has maintained throughout. We follow the guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), Kendall County Health Department and the local schools. As their guidance changes, our response changes to match within a practical timeframe.

This applies to the restrictions we put in place as well as to the limits of the restrictions we put in place. If an individual is following the guidance provided by the CDC and IDPH, we don't want to be further restrictive unless we have special circumstances. We have no expertise to justify more or less restrictive measures.

The church itself does not limit the building use as long as the usage adheres to current guidance provided by CDC and IDPH. However, as a church, much of our activity relies on volunteers. Volunteers may feel comfortable with further restrictions for the added safety of themselves or others, or they might cancel or postpone the event. Our volunteers need to feel safe and this is handled on a case-by-case basis.

Currently, the CDC recommends that unvaccinated and fully vaccinated people wear a mask in public indoor settings in areas of substantial or high transmission. As of September 24th, Kendall County is an area of high transmission. On August 26th, the Governor of Illinois issued executive order number 87 stating people "shall be required to cover their nose and mouth with a face covering when in an indoor public place." Furthermore, "face coverings may be removed temporarily while actively eating or drinking and may be removed by workers at workplaces when they can consistently maintain six feet of distance."

Our church is an indoor public place, so we require masks. If we have food served in the church for a special event, face coverings may be temporarily removed to put the food into our faces.

We know what to do. Love God, love yourself, love your neighbor and love your enemy. Bear the fruit of the Holy Spirit and grow. Let this consume our thoughts and motivate our actions.

We think of ourselves as an action-oriented church. Get involved in the action. 


