

When a rich man came up to Jesus, asking him what he must do to gain eternal life, Jesus told the man to keep the commandments. Following a time of dormancy during the pandemic, The Green Group started meeting monthly in early spring of 2021. We found new energy and new interest in caring for our Earth. We are growing our thoughts and membership with hopes to bloom some sustainable projects.

The Green Group formed a committee of 10 people who have been doing some deep research over the past eight months and learning about solar panels:

- how they work
- why they are good for reducing fossil fuel energy consumption
- to what extent they help to reduce carbon in our atmosphere
- what are different ways to install panels (without a rooftop)
- how much money can be saved long-term by using solar panels

Love our Neighbors: Refugees in Kane and Kendall Counties

HEAR THE CALL FOR HELP!

Several of our church members volunteered for World Relief (Aurora area) prior to the start of the pandemic; some have returned to help in safe conditions. Two members from Love Your Neighbor at YCUCC continue their service by setting up apartments (eight in last few weeks), driving new arrivals from airport to their first residency, and acting as a "friendship partner."

Notes from World Relief in the Aurora regional area.:

- We are preparing to resettle 750+ refugees in Chicagoland this year (October 2021 September 2022)
- In addition to the 750 refugees, we'll also be resettling 150+ Afghans evacuated out of Afghanistan in the last month

 In September alone, we resettled 48 refugees – we haven't resettled that many people in one month since 2017

- Top needs for volunteering include:
 - Apartment Setup Assistants
 - Transportation Assistants
 - Warehouse Assistants
 - Friendship partners

We, at YCUCC, can join the World Relief global network of over 95,000 volunteers positively impacting our world. Learn more about volunteer opportunities:



Energy Saving Tips

especially for the holiday season

"Many of us will be thankful for delicious home cooked dinners and baked goods during the holiday season. But did you know that cooking accounts for 4.5% of total energy use in U.S. homes? And that figure doesn't include the energy associated with refrigeration, hot water heating, and dishwashing. Added together, that means that as much as 15% of the energy in the average American home is used in the kitchen."

Put your food in the oven right away

Place your food in the oven as it warms up to use all the heat available. Don't wait until the oven is preheated to start baking large dishes like a turkey or casseroles.

Get excited about meal prepping

Start planning your meals to cook as many items in your oven at once. If you can't cook dishes at the same time, try to cook them back to back.

Give your heating system a break

Turn down your heat a few degrees when you start cooking. The heat from your cooking can help keep the house cozy for you and your guests.

Give your furnace the day off

Winter's holiday parties are a big part of the season, and most of us find ourselves with a houseful of people at least once between now and the New Year. If your next party involves a lot work for your stove, think about turning down your furnace to compensate. The heat of the oven—and all those quests—will keep the temperature comfortable, and your furnace won't have to work so hard.

Use other small appliances for cooking

Don't neglect your crock pot. Or your microwave, toaster oven, or warming plate. Most of us have a veritable smorgasbord of small kitchen cooking appliances that we rarely use. Putting them to work more often instead of the oven or stovetop can mean significant energy savings.

Ranges

When you're cooking, adjust the flame to fit the bottom of the pot or pan. Turning up the flame beyond the bottom only wastes energy.

Keep the burner surfaces clean.

Cover pots and pans with lids when cooking.

Cook food at high heat to bring to temperature then reduce to complete cooking.






