

It was relatively early in my career and it was before I became involved here at YCUCC. In 2005, my list was: my family, my health, my house and my work.

Today, my list is a little different: my family, my health and my church. YCUCC is important to me because I care about the good work the church does and because I care about the people that do it.

What is most important to you? To what will you train your compass? Choose your direction and keep walking, one step at a time.

Health, in her excellent book, *Glorify, Reclaiming The Heart Of Progressive Christianity*:

"It's time for progressive Christians to claim discipleship. It's time to get radical, not about our politics or our policies, but about our faith. It's time to stop throwing the baby Jesus out with the bathwater, and start putting the horse before the cart. It's time to remember what, and whom, we worship, and to develop the language of faith.


And it's time to see our social justice work as a natural product of our discipleship, not something that competes with it for the church's time."

Sunday School




