Sign up now for a Passover Seder dinner April 14

On Thursday, April 14, Holy Thursday, Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ will host a unique event: **Messiah in the Passover**, a demonstration showing how Jesus fulfilled the ancient feast of Passover.

Chosen People Ministries, a world-wide ministry dedicated to reaching, discipling, praying for, and serving the Jewish community with the gospel of Jesus, will present the program. They will lead the demonstration to give the Christian community insight into Jewish traditions to better understand the shared roots and heritage of Christians and Jews. More information can be found on www.ChosenPeople.com.

Messiah in the Passover begins with the traditional Passover Seder table--complete with the articles of this Jewish celebration. They will explain the symbolic meanings of the various items of the Passover feast and highlight their relationship to the Last Supper that Jesus celebrated with the disciples. Roasted chicken will be served in addition to the less familiar Seder dishes.

Volunteers are also needed to help prepare some of the Seder dishes- recipes will be provided. Sign-up sheets are on the bulletin board in the Narthex for the dinner and for help with the Seder dishes.

Reservations for the Seder meal are needed Tickets are \$10, \$3 for children under 12. Child care will be available. Non-church members are also most welcome so feel free to invite friends to join you.

Luke DeFuss





His parents ...my son Mike and beautiful daughter in law Alissa have stressed for several months...he just turned 2 months old. They are without a doubt God's chosen people to love this little boy. Wyatt has many obstacles to overcome...surgeries... infusions...therapy...development delays...but there is one thing for cer-

tain...despite his disabilities...he is an amazing spark in this crazy world. And it makes me feel that there is not a better family to love and cheer him on...many family members have been there for support, and it is so appreciated...and his smile...well it melts my heart. Wyatt's church family wants to support his family by sponsoring a **Pancake Breakfast**. Adult Sunday School meets every other week in the conference room from 9 to 9:45 on Sunday mornings. We are continuing our study of Christian Hope using the *Being Reformed: Faith Seeking Understanding* series. All are welcome, so please join us! *Note that the weeks vary slightly this month due to the Easter holiday.

- April 3--Session 4--Christ's Return and the Last Judgment. Belief in Christ's return and Last Judgment is foundational to Christian faith and expresses our corporate hope for the establishment of God's justice.
- **April 24**--Session 5--The New Creation--Christian hope has a cosmic dimension: God's promised future of redemption and renewal is not simply good news for human beings but for all of creation.
- **May 1**--Session 6 (The final session in our study)--The Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper remind us that our hope for the future is rooted in God's past faithfulness and present sustaining grace.


