The following is a post on Facebook from Lorrie, Wyatt Jones' grand-mother shared by Art Prochaska, Wyatt's grandfather (February 7th).

I'd like to say I'm grateful... but the word grateful doesn't seem to be a good enough word to describe my feelings. Months ago, this little guy was diagnosed before he was born with Osteogenic Imperfecta aka: Brittle Bone Disease...He is a true little warrior ...he has already had multiple fractures and breaks before he took his first breath...he fractured his arm in the hospital...nobody could explain. His parents ...my son Mike and beautiful daughter-in-law Alissa have stressed for several months...he just turned 2 months old. They are without a doubt God's chosen people to love this little boy. Wyatt has many obstacles to overcome... surgeries...infusions...therapy...development delays...but there is one thing for certain... despite his disabilities...he is an amazing spark in this crazy world. And it makes me feel that there is not a better family to love and cheer him on...many family members have been there for support, and it is so appreciated...and his smile...well, it melts my heart. Wyatt's church family wants to support his family by sponsoring a Pancake Breakfast. The men from the Building and Grounds committee will be in the kitchen flipping pancakes and the confirmation kids have offered to help serve. Come hungry and stay for pancakes May 15th immediately after Sunday School and Worship. Wyatt will be receiving therapy and infusions at Shriners Children's Hospital.

Dear Members of Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ,

As members of the Search Committee, we want to express our gratitude for the trust you have placed in us and the prayers that have helped sustain our work. We have concluded our process of reviewing profiles and interviewing candidates, and we have reached a unanimous decision. We are pleased to recommend to you our final candidate for settled full-time Pastor of YCUCC to be considered by the congregation at a special meeting on **Sunday May 15, 2022,** immediately following worship.

We are grateful to our conference minister, Reverend Stephanie Perdew, who worked closely with us in the Search and Call process. Here is a brief review of steps that led us to this point of confidence in the Spirit's leading:

YCUCC members and friends engaged in both the Heritage sessions and Visioning sessions held in early 2021 to generate insights and ideas about where we have been and where we want to go. These ideas were incorporated into our Search Profile for candidates to read to learn about YCUCC.

Our position was listed in UCC Ministry Opportunities and on numerous seminary websites.

- We received a total of 11 profiles to review and from those conducted interviews. We completed our due diligence by thoroughly checking references and maintaining contact with our conference minister for guidance.
- We hosted our candidate for an in-person interview and a tour of our church and community, all the while seeking to discern God's will for all parties involved.
- After prayerful consideration, our candidate has enthusiastically responded to our invitation for a candidating weekend to meet our church family and lead us in worship.

Confidentiality has been essential to the entire process, and we are grateful to the congregation for continued support during the search. It is important to honor the integrity of our discernment and respect the candidate's current ministry setting; therefore, the candidate's name will not be shared until the candidating weekend. You will have an opportunity to meet the candidate on Saturday May 14 at an informal social event held at church. We encourage all members to attend on Sunday May 15 when the candidate leads our worship service; members will be asked to vote on approval of this candidate at the special congregational meeting immediately following that service.

We are blessed with a wonderful church community. With hard work and God's guidance, we will be blessed with a wonderful pastor to guide our ministry together in the name of Jesus Christ.

KENDALL COUNTY PADS UPDATE

Our church was part of Kendall County PADS from the very beginning in 2010. While the program provided immense help to the homeless in Kendall County, the COVID pandemic made it impossible to continue as it had been operating. In March, the PADS Board of Directors made the difficult decision to disband. While the worst of the pandemic may be past, concerns about changes at some PADS sites and about recruiting enough volunteers post-COVID prompted this decision. During the past year and a half, PADS volunteers have instead assisted Daybreak Shelter in Joliet, the shelter serving Kendall County, by providing a meal once a month. Some of us from YCUCC, would like to continue this as a mission of our church. PADS food team members from Cross Lutheran Church can provide a meal every other month. On April 21, the Shepherds Leadership Team gave the go ahead to try to continue this project.

Five YCUCC members have been serving most of the meals at Daybreak and are willing to keep doing this. What we ask from our church members is donations of food. Each monthly meal includes a main dish with meat and side dishes like vegetables, pasta, salad or fruit, and dessert. If you would be willing to provide any of these items- maybe once a year- please email either Kathy Farren, <u>ednpub@earthlink.net</u>, or Sandy Lindblom, slind55378@aol.com . Daybreak serves lunch for up to about 40 homeless people each day. However, cooking can be split- so no one has to donate the main dish for all 40 people, for example.

If you would like to help, but don't cook, you could also donate an Aldi gift card that can be used by someone who does cook.

Even though PADS has ended, the needs of the homeless continue. Please help us by giving Daybreak guests some good, homemade food once a month.

• **April 24**--Session 5--The New Creation--Christian hope has a cosmic dimension: God's promised future of redemption and renewal is not simply good news for human beings but for all of creation.

• **May 1**--Session 6 (The final session in our study)--The Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper remind us that our hope for the future is rooted in God's past faith-fulness and present sustaining grace.
