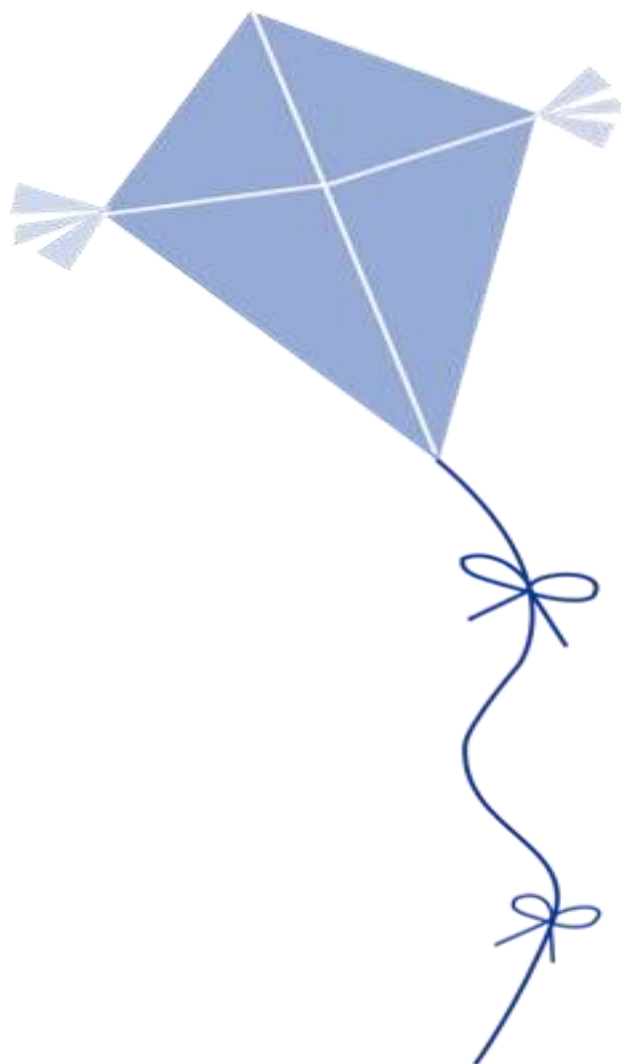

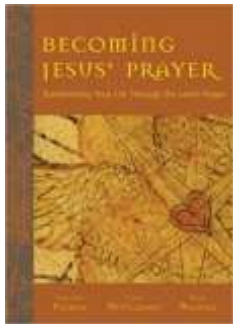
I used to think that "leaving it up to God" was a crutch that unmotivated people used to avoid taking action and responsibility. I thought it was a careless strategy when things got challenging.

SOLAR ENERGY TO ELECTRICAL ENERGY

An awning of 30 solar panels was recently installed on the south wall of the church by Independence Renewable Energy (IRE) of Sandwich. After an inspection and check by ComEd, the system will be activated, and the solar panels will provide about one-third of the electrical energy needed by the church.

The project was accomplished with a collaborative effort of the Green Group, Shepherds' Leadership Team, and Building and Grounds crews over the past 14 months. Harvesting solar energy is one more example of good environmental practices by our church.

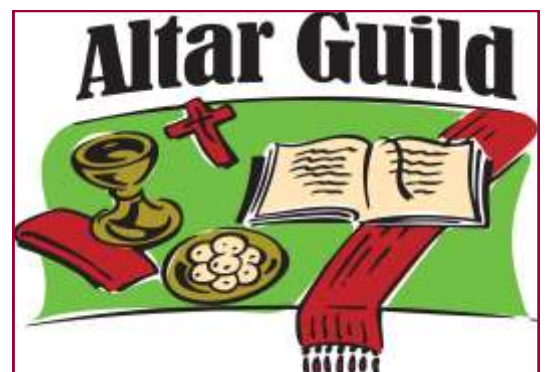

KENDALL COUNTY PADS UPDATE

Our church was part of Kendall County PADS from the very beginning in 2010. While the program provided immense help to the homeless in Kendall County, the COVID pandemic made it impossible to continue as it had been operating. What we ask from our church members is donations of food. Each monthly meal includes a main dish with meat and side dishes like vegetables, pasta, salad or fruit, and dessert. If you would be willing to provide any of these items- maybe once a year- please email either Kathy Farren, ednpub@earthlink.net, or Sandy Lindblom, slind55378@aol.com . Daybreak serves lunch for up to about 40 homeless people each day. However, cooking can be split- so no one has to donate the main dish for all 40 people, for example. If you would like to help, but don't cook, you could also donate an Aldi gift card that can be used by someone who does cook.

Even though PADS has ended, the needs of the homeless continue. Please help us by giving Daybreak guests some good, homemade food once a month.

**Note that the weeks vary slightly this month due to the Easter holiday.*

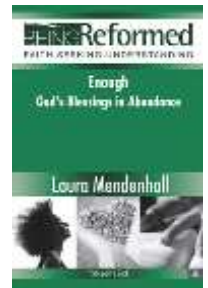

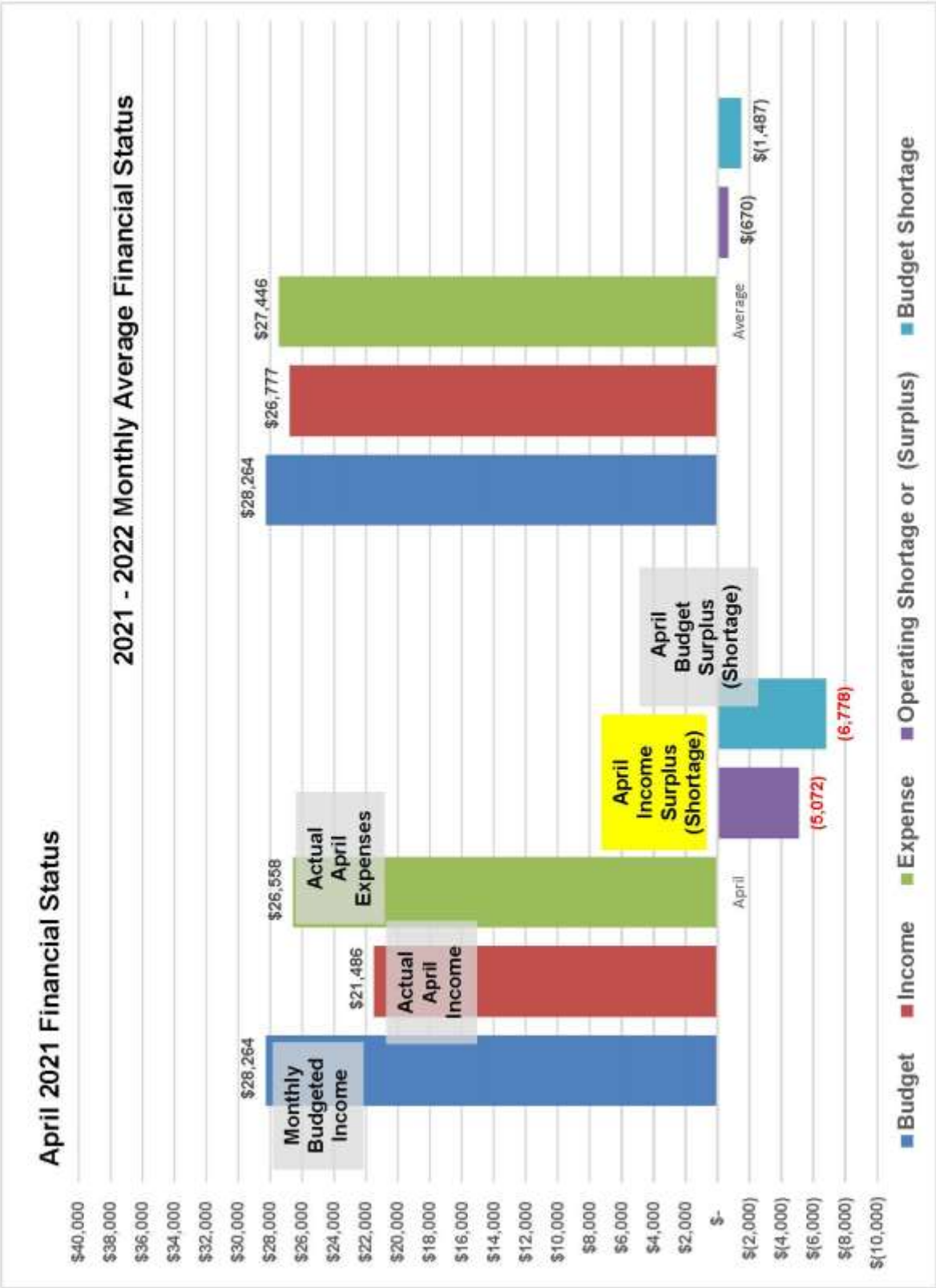
