YORKVILLE CONGREGATIONAL UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST IS RICH IN HISTORY

Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ is rich in history. Its roots can be traced back to 1834 when settlers formed Baptist and Congregationalist Churches north and south of the Fox River. We thought it would be interesting to share some history in our newsletter.

Visitors and members undoubtedly notice the beautiful lighted stained-glass painting of Christ and the children located on the east wall of the Narthex leading into Fellowship Hall. That lovely piece of art is from the original Yorkville Congregational Church that was located at 107 W. Center Street in Yorkville. The building is now known as Chapel on the Green and is a wonderful piece of Yorkville history located in the heart of the city.

The painting was donated in 1956 by the Ira Perkins Family in honor of Ira's wife, Lillian. In the old church building it hung on the second floor in the Sunday School area. Mrs. Perkins taught Sunday School for many years there. Her son, Dale Perkins, is still a regular at YCUCC.

The painting, along with a small church window from the east side of the balcony, were taken to the new Yorkville Congregational Church building in Countryside Center in 1989 to honor and preserve the history of the old church.



Since Kendall County PADS stopped operating, our church has been part of a ministry serving lunch to the homeless at the Daybreak Shelter in Joliet. Cross Lutheran Church members alternate months providing the food.

We are looking for a few more YCC members to donate and cook lunch for Daybreak residents on the third Fridays in July, September and November.

Each monthly meal includes a main dish with meat and side dishes like vegetables, pasta or potatoes, salad or fruit, and dessert. If you would be willing to provide any of these items - maybe once a year- please email either Kathy Farren, ednpub@earthlink.net, or Sandy Lindblom, slind55378@aol.com. Daybreak serves lunch for up to about 40 homeless people each day. However, cooking can be split so no one has to donate the entire main dish for all 40 people, for example. If you would like to help, but don't cook, you could also donate an Aldi gift card that can be used by someone who does cook.

Even though PADS has ended, the needs of the homeless continue. Please help us by giving Daybreak guests some good, homemade food once a month.







As adult education coordinator, my goal is to provide opportunities for adults to explore their faith, feed their souls, and then reach out and seek understanding of others.



- August 14--Session 6 (the last session)--How Much Is Enough to Leave Our Children?




Spiritual Development Group

- July 19--Chapter 6: **Jesus' Prayer Makes Us One**




