The Love Your Neighbor Ministry has an exciting new collection this fall/winter for a refugee family. We've been asked not to make the name of the







Kill-a-What? Kill-A-Watt!

Gail Gaebler shared her kill-a-watt meter during a Green Team moment at a service in June. Perhaps you were there to hear it. A Kill-A-Watt is an electricity usage monitor that measures the energy used by devices. What uses more energy, your coffee maker, or your air fryer? Your floor lamp or your box fan? Simply plug the kill-a-watt monitor into the wall and then plug your appliance into the monitor. Instantly it will tell you how much energy is being consumed. This lets you know which appliances are costing the most so you can modify their use as needed to reduce your energy bill at home.



CHALLENGE: Our Green Team has three Kill-A-Watt monitors, and our goal for October is to get all three of them loaned out to members of our congregation. YES, there are PRIZES for the first three homes to accept our challenge. Simply contact the office to reserve your unit. Our hope is to have the units in as many homes as possible this month. Book Discussion




