Hello Church Family,

Advent is upon us, beginning with the Hanging of the Greens on November 27th. I look forward to participating in this important YCUCC tradition. Christmas is full of family and church traditions that help guide and ground us during this season of seeking and celebrating.

I remember making advent wreaths as a family, lighting each candle at the dinner table as a child, and then with my own children when they were younger. It gave us time as a family to ponder what was ahead: Christmas.

We have used a family advent calendar with stuffed shapes that go on a Christmas tree. This marks the time for us to know when Christmas is upon us. I discovered an Advent book, <u>All Creation Waits</u>, by Gayle Boss. Each day an essay and woodcarving remind us how creation responds to darkness and light. The book begins with this quote:

"Every single creature is full of God and is a book about God. Every creature is a word of God. If I spend enough time with the tiniest creature, even a caterpillar, I would never have to prepare a sermon. So full of God is every creature" —Meister Eckhart

Advent reminds us that as we wait, we do God's work, the work of the church. The work of building a beloved community for all God's Creation.

Advent ends with Christmas and the celebration of Jesus's birth, the Prince of Peace. The birth reminds us that we are all created in God's image, and it is up to us to use God's transformational love to create God's beloved community on Earth.

I look forward to this advent as we wait and watch together for Jesus' birth.

YCUCC YOUTH PLAN MISSION TRIP IN 2023



It has been five years since the last mission trip of YCUCC. The Alpha youth group is preparing to attend a mission trip with the organization Youthworks in June of 2023. The dates of the mission trip are Sunday, June 11 – Friday, June 16, 2023.

YCUCC Alpha youth will work alongside Youthworks and serve the greater urban area of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Though people may not think of Milwaukee as an area of need, it is. Youthworks has partnered with various groups in the Milwaukee area to serve those in need since 1999.

Our group will partner with local organizations to meet ongoing needs in the community. Students may serve all or part of the week at a food shelf, clothing distribution center, soup kitchen, children's program, or elder care facilities.

The cost per student (and chaperone) is \$400.00; the monies will be due in segments over the next few months. We are hoping students will cover half of their cost and earn the rest through fundraising. So, there is a lot of work to do, and these young people are up to the challenge.




Spiritual Development Group

The A.I.D. TREE



How you can have a GREEN, GREEN Christmas

Shop Local: Support local merchants and retailers by shopping for gifts locally. If you are not sure what to get, purchase gift certificates from area shops and restaurants. By staying local you will also use less gas during your Christmas shopping.

Wrapping Presents: Over the holidays over 227,000 miles of wrapping paper gets thrown away - enough to circle the world 9 times. Nearly all of the wrapping paper you find in stores is not recyclable because of the shiny coatings, foils, and colors on it. Get creative wrapping your presents.

- Wrap presents with old maps or the comic sections of a newspaper.
- Another idea is to use a scarf, dish towel, or other useful cloth items that are a gift in and of itself.

What to do with your cut tree after Christmas:

- Cut the tree into smaller chunks and gather them into a pile in your yard or garden. Let the pile sit until the pine needles have fallen off and the branches are dry and brittle. Then, use these brown materials as a carbon source for your compost bin. By saving the pine needles and branches from your dead Christmas tree, you can add brown and green materials to your compost bin all season long.
- Chip the wood. Wood chips are one of the best choices to fill in garden paths, smother weeds, and mulch your flower beds. A thick layer of wood chips is far more effective for killing weeds than a sheet of plastic. Wood chips block sunlight while still allowing water and air to circulate through, so the soil food web stays intact.
- Put out the branches to provide shelter for pollinators and wildlife as well as giving perennials and shrubs extra protection from winter weather.
- Redecorate your tree as an outdoor bird feeder. String it with popcorn and cranberry garland or other bird-friendly goodies. Add pine cones filled with peanut butter or homemade suet too!
- Pile tree boughs around tree trunks to discourage critters from eating the bark.
- Your Christmas tree is a great fuel for an outdoor fire pit. Use the twigs as kindling, and cut the trunk into logs for burning.
- In the City of Yorkville, Christmas trees will be collected free of charge during the first 2 weeks of January. Trees do not require a sticker, but do need to be free of all ornamentation, tinsel, garland, and lights. Put the old / dead tree on the curb to be picked up with your trash.


