We are serving lunch at Hesed house on March 4. There will be a sign-up to serve at Hesed house and a chance to donate to purchase supplies.


Food pantry food drive the week of March 12. We will ask you to drop off donations for the food pantry this week.

The Missions Ministry budgeted line item of \$300.00 for Hesed House in Aurora was sent in December.

Our first walk will be **Saturday, February 11, 10 a.m. at Silver Springs State Park.** We will meet at Loon Lake, at the eastern entrance (fishing entrance off Fox Road) where

there is plenty of parking.

The Loon Lake paved path, about one mile, will be our first walk. After arriving, meet up and find a couple of walking buddies, and set your own speed and number of loops. If anyone would like to add steps beyond the Loon Lake path, come earlier or

stay later if you wish. You can add the Ridge Trail through the woods, the path near the Springs, the prairie loop, or the trail along the Fox River. Take photos! It is a beautiful park in all seasons.

Following your walk, meet at the picnic table to find a cup of hot chocolate with marshmallows (or a bottle of cold water) waiting for you.



Let's give it a try, and please give your input for future walks.










Can you find the underlined words from this Bible verse about what love is in the puzzle below? Think about what God says love is while you answer the questions at the bottom of the page.




