From the Desk of the Chair

I was feeling overwhelmed last week and knew I needed to catch my breath and free my mind, no matter how big the pile on my desk appeared to be. I wandered into the woods taking a deep breath. Ironically, the natural wonder that most captured my attention was the Spring Beauty, one of

the first woodland wildflowers of the season, and one of the smallest. I found myself focused intently on that flower. I recognized its two tiny leaves that have been up for a month or better, just waiting for the right time to prod those blossoms into bloom. The thin stem was supporting guite a bouquet of blossoms. Peering intently, I focused on the bright pink stripes



that lead the way down the petals right into the center, those stripes that direct the pollinators to the pollen. How is it, I wondered, that these tiny flowers come up every year, without fail, through our crazy Illinois spring weather? They are found by the pollinators, they are celebrated by the woodland wildflower enthusiasts, and I doubt they ever worry about a single thing. I thought about the birds of air and the flowers of the field, and if God cares for all of them, then certainly God will look after me as well, right? (Matthew 6:26-30)

My walk in the woods provided some clarity. At YCUCC, we are preparing for our Annual Meeting on May 21. We will be voting on our budget, our new and returning Shepherds, and our city park proposal. The Personnel ministry is beginning the search for a new Christian Education Director. The mission trip and VBS are right around the corner, and we've got a beautiful building and grounds to maintain. Every ministry is actively engaged in the work of our church. If God has his eye on the birds and the flowers, then surely God has an eye on us as well. Every Tuesday at 9:00 a.m. our Building and Grounds team meets to discuss and act on issues concerning the church building and surrounding property. Since we meet (and work) in the mornings, on week days, our members tend to be retired. Brian Bazan, Andy Hamblin, Jeff Kline, and Bob McGee are dedicated to the Church and its operations.



Robin Campos keeps our group organized and provides essential

communication, not only for our group, but communicates important information to our congregation. Robin keeps us on task by providing a weekly agenda. She contacts vendors and contractors to obtain bids for projected work as well as for emergency work.

If any building work is needed (roof repair, painting, electrical, plumbing, etc.) or work outside (grass cutting, snow removal) is necessary, our Building and Grounds team must either do the actual work or establish contracts with vendors to complete necessary tasks. Our building is over 30 years old and, just like your house, almost everything wears out. We have to replace materials as they wear out or hire contractors to complete necessary work.

In my former life as a high school science teacher, I was the science chair at Wheaton Warrenville South High School. I was National Board Certified as a biology teacher, and worked for the Illinois State Board of Education in an effort to have other science teachers in northern Illinois obtain National Board Certification. Also, I taught Genetics and Biotechnology to high school students in the summer at Northwestern University. I am most proud of our children: Nikki teaches science at Washington Middle School in Naperville, T.J. is the foreman for Parks and Recreation for the City of Yorkville, and Alex served in the U.S. Army for 16 years, obtaining a Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree.

Much of our work is mundane (i.e., we move a lot of tables and chairs) and we provide assistance to other church groups (Joy Circle and their Rummage Sale, Worship Committee, Fellowship, and Christian Education). Help YCUCC Shine on the 4th of July!

The weather may not feel like it, but it really won't be long until the Fourth of July.

Yorkville's Independence Day celebration provides our church with three opportunities to be more visible to the community.

We will be having an entry in the parade, manning the bounce houses in the Town Square Park after the parade, and then letting people gather in the church parking lot to watch the fireworks at dusk.

Volunteers will be needed to walk in the parade which steps off at 9 a.m. and lasts about an hour. Including the time to line up before 9 a.m., this is about a 2 hour commitment. People will also be needed to help with the bounce houses. The City of Yorkville is providing the bounce houses and getting them inflated and ready. Our job will be to stand at the entrance and exit points to make sure there aren't too many kids in at one time and that kids are safely leaving the bounce houses. We will have cards with information about YCUCC activities- like Vacation Bible School- to hand out to parents. Activities in the park start as the parade ends and conclude by 12:30 or 1 p.m. at the latest.

Finally, our location close to where the fireworks will be set off gives us an opportunity to meet with even more community residents in our own parking lot. Last year,

the gaga ball pit was set up for kids to use before the fireworks and the church distributed free snow cones. Again, this is no more than about a two hour commitment.

Each of these activities would allow you to attend your own family picnics, cookouts or pool parties, and still have time to help the church early in the day or in the evening.

When July 4 gets closer, there will be sign-up sheets for volunteers. Keep us in mind and plan to help spread the word about YCUCC sometime on July 4.

New Communion Ware Set!

Have you seen our new communion ware set? It is a ceramic set made by Gavin Finefield of Finefield pottery, who is also an ordained minister. You may be asking, "Why do we need a new set?" "What's wrong with our traditional silver set that maintains our church history?" Recently, our silver set needed a repair to the handle at the top of the pitcher. The craftsman doing the repair discovered that the set is lead-lined with silver plating. That is not an issue. The problem arises because the finishes on the pitcher and the cups have been compromised, which may lead to leakage of the lead. The Worship and Spiritual Growth ministry was then faced with a decision of having to have



the set replated or go with a new set. The decision was made to go with the new set, which has been donated by Carol Falato as a gift to the church. It is a beautiful set, and we look forward to using it for many years to come. Our original set can still be viewed and appreciated in the cabinet outside the office, alongside many of our other original worship accessories. City Park Plan FAQs

Will the church be selling the property to the City?

• No, the property will be deeded to the City for the purpose of a park. There is no cost to the church, and there will be no monetary exchange.

What benefits will YCUCC receive in this exchange?

- The park will include a 26' x 40' pavilion.
- The park will include a playground for tots.
- YCUCC will have the south parking area paved with about 13 spaces facing the building.
- A concrete pad will be installed under our garbage and recycling bins next to the garage.
- A concrete pad will be installed on the north side of the church for our paper recycling bins.
- The park will have a portable restroom unit with a privacy enclosure.
- YCUCC mowing will be reduced, therefore reducing our cost for lawn care.
- Soft benefits include more visibility in the community with a park on site. Young families who visit the park may be drawn to our congregation.

Will YCUCC be able to use the pavilion?

- Yes. The City will grant 10 reservation dates each calendar year to YCUCC with no charge. The church can use the pavilion for VBS, church picnics, and other church events.
- The park and pavilion are open to the community and to our congregation without reservation any day of the year.
- The pavilion will hold 100 people and will come with picnic tables.
- The location of the pavilion, near the garage, will make it easy to add tables and/ or chairs for special events, services, programs.
- Our Building and Grounds team struggles to meet the demands of outdoor events with setting up tables and chairs. The pavilion makes all of this much easier.

Will solar panels be installed on the pavilion to meet church energy needs?

• The pavilion will NOT have solar panels installed. We are looking into solar panels for the garage. There were too many potential conflicts with different owners of land, pavilion, solar panels, and produced electricity.

What will be included in the Pavilion?

- Yes electrical outlets, enclosed and locked
- No plumbing; no water
- 4 moveable picnic tables from the City

When the City's Parks and Rec Department designs the park, will they be willing to get input from members of the Green Team and SLT? Yes.

What liabilities will the church incur for this project?

- None. The City will be liable for park usage and will conduct monthly and annual required inspections.
- The City will maintain the park (mowing, cleaning, repairs, etc.).

When will this project get started and be finished?

• The project is expected to be installed this summer and ready for use by fall.

Will the church have an attorney to review the contract with the City of Yorkville? Yes.

There are three residential properties adjacent or near the proposed park. Have these neighbors been given information about the proposed park?

• Yes. Two employees of City of Yorkville's Department of Parks and Recreation and a member for the YCUCC's Green Team visited these three residencies and gave them informational handouts.

Who will own the south parking lot? Who has liability for injuries in the south parking lot?

- YCUCC currently owns and will continue to own the south parking lot.
- YCUCC has liability for both the south parking lot and for the east parking lot
- Park users will likely use our south parking lot.

Who will be responsible for maintenance, repairs, and snow plowing for the south parking lot?

• YCUCC owns the parking lot and will be responsible for maintenance, repairs and snow plowing What potential problems may occur in a Yorkville City park?

- Vandalism. City parks do experience many different types of vandalism; however, we do not expect YCC to be affected.
- Injuries/Crimes. Public use parks have no liability. They are accepted as "use at your own risk" areas. The church would never have any liability in any case.


Adult Education




