

Radical welcome is radical inclusivity and is a new way of seeing and doing. Radical welcome is moving past the us-es* and the thems* and engaging those on the margin. (*Bishop Yvette Flunder)

Open: Being open is to pay attention to all that is God in the margins of our world. We open our hearts and minds to unknowing and being ready to be changed by God's transformational love and opening our hearts and minds knowing that God's love will help us unknow what we have learned as harmful and relearn what is good in the eyes of God.

Restore: God offers us a new life in Christ, the new life that is restored when we focus on loving our neighbor and ourselves. God calls for us to restore our communities and ourselves by reconciling with God and our communities and working together towards a new creation with grace, peace, justice, and mercy.

Knit: We are knitted together with God's love. Our communities are better when we build each other up and learn from each other. God calls us to create bridges and open gates to care for each other. The different stitches and colors that make up an afghan are unique and diverse. When one thread is broken, the afghan will be broken until it is knitted back together. God knitted us and created us in God's own image. God knits us together with love.

I look forward to a summer of doing God's work and spending time on the porch watching time stand still with our church family.

From the Desk of the Chair



If you are interested in joining the building and grounds crew, please contact Robin Campos or Tony Houle. Meetings take place every Tuesday at 9:00 am.


SLT MEET AND GREET: Lou Ann Hoffman and Kathy Farren

Sign up to help YCUCC shine on July 4

Yorkville's Independence Day celebration provides our church with three opportunities to be more visible to the community- and have some fun at the same time. Sign up sheets will be in the Narthex after June 1.

We will be having an entry in the parade, manning the bounce houses in the Town Square Park after the parade, and then letting people gather in the church parking lot to watch the fireworks at dusk.

Volunteers will be needed to walk in the parade which steps off at 9 a.m. and lasts about an hour. Including the time to line up before 9 a.m., this is about a 2 hour commitment.

People will also be needed to help with the bounce houses. The City of Yorkville is providing the bounce houses and getting them inflated and ready. Our job will be to stand at the entrance and exit points to make sure there aren't too many kids in at one time and that kids are safely leaving the bounce houses. We will have cards with information about YCUCC activities- like Vacation Bible School- to hand out to parents. Activities in the park start as the parade ends and conclude by 12:30 or 1 p.m. at the latest.

Finally, our location close to where the fireworks will be set off gives us an opportunity to meet with even more community residents in our own parking lot. Last year, the gaga ball pit was set up for kids to use before the fireworks and the church distributed free snow cones. Again, this is no more than about a two hour commitment.

Each of these activities would allow you to attend your own family picnics, cookouts or pool parties, and still have time to help the church early in the day or in the evening.

We will need MANY of you to help with these fun activities and help spread the word about YCUCC.

New City Park will Offer Opportunities for YCUCC

Members in attendance at YCUCC's annual meeting on Sunday May 21 voted "yes" (73-11) to move forward to work with City of Yorkville on a park project on a small parcel of the Church property.

Approximately .5 acres of church property on the south side will be deeded to the city for the purpose of a park, which includes a "tot" playground, for ages 2 - 10 years old and 26' x 40' pavilion with electricity. There will be no cost to the church, and there will be no monetary exchange.

The church will have no liability for the park. The city will be responsible for required regular inspections and maintenance, including mowing, cleaning, and repairs.

In exchange for the land, YCUCC will have the south parking area paved with about 13 spaces facing the building. Concrete pads will be installed for garbage dumpsters next to the garage and for paper recycling bins north of the church.

- The church will be granted 10 reserved dates to use the pavilion and park each year.
 (Church may reserve additional dates, if needed.)
- The church will have opportunities to use the pavilion (and playground) for many different events, such as church services, picnics, fall festival, VBS, Sunday School classes, youth activities, and special programs.
- Members of church may want to use the pavilion for special events, such as graduations, anniversaries, funerals, birthdays, and scout programs; all will need to be reserved through the city.
- YCUCC will gain more visibility in the community with a park on site.
- Young families who visit the park may be drawn to our congregation.
- YCUCC will be able to place a sign with church name and contact information (QR Code linking to website) on church property visible from the park.

The legal agreement will include (a) reverter clause, which says that if at any time in the future, the city decides not to use the property for the intended use of park, the property would revert to the church; and (b) review clause, which says the city and/or church may ask for a review of the terms of the contract every five years.

NEXT STEPS will include the writing of a contract with the City of Yorkville. Church member Fred Dickson, attorney, will represent YCUCC. Members of the Green Team will meet with City's Building and Grounds personnel to collaborate on the design components. Our church's SLT will review the contract and will sign it when it meets the expectations of the church.

UPDATES on the project will be through announcements and The Happenings.

Due to many donations from church family & community for the spring sale, we still needed to borrow eight more 6' tables from our church family!
