What has Building and Grounds been up to?

This month the Building and Grounds crew has been doing a lot of tidying up around the building. One of the big projects that was completed was patching of all the large potholes in the parking lot. I know all of our cars are

very thankful for this. Another project that is in the process of being completed is the reorganization of the garage. The crew was out in the heat of the summer building shelves, throwing away old items we no longer need and creating more garage storage for larger items. The south side of the building was also painted to match the rest of the building this past month.

Some larger Building and Grounds items include painting the west side exterior peaks and the hood fire suppression system in the kitchen.

After meeting with two fire safety companies and the Bristol Kendall Fire Department, it has come to a conclusion that we do not need to have a suppression system in the kitchen since we purchased two residential ranges. Per the recommendation of the fire department, we will be purchasing fire blankets to replace the system. They also recommended using the hood fan every time the ranges are in use.

Have you ever noticed that the back of the building is a different color? We have received a few guotes from commercial painters for painting and caulking of the peaks on the back of the building. Due to higher than expected costs, this project will be put off for now so we can consider some fundraising opportunities.

What are the 3Rs?

The principle of reducing waste, reusing and recycling resources and products is often called the "3Rs." **Reducing** means choosing to use things with care to reduce the amount of waste generated. **Reusing** involves the repeated use of items or parts of items which still have usable aspects. In other words, it is important to share materials rather than just throw them away. **Recycling** is to convert waste into reusable material.



We accomplish the 3R's by hosting rummage sales!

Our YCUCC family and community members...

- 1. **Reduce** items in our homes by donating unwanted items to the sale instead of throwing them out.
- 2. **Reuse** by continuing the use of items that are still usable benefitting the community.
- 3. **Recycle** by sending the remaining, unsold items to Wayside Cross for continued use of the original, donated items.

By following the concept of the 3R's, we are given the opportunity to serve our church family, the community, and charitable organizations. The cycle continues with donating remaining items to Wayside Cross!

Sign up to help YCUCC shine on July 4

Yorkville's Independence Day celebration provides our church with three opportunities to be more visible to the community- and have some fun at the same time. Sign up sheets will be in the Narthex after June 1.

We will be having an entry in the parade, manning the bounce houses in the Town Square Park after the parade, and then letting people gather in the church parking lot to watch the fireworks at dusk.

Volunteers will be needed to walk in the parade which steps off at 9 a.m. and lasts about an hour. Including the time to line up before 9 a.m., this is about a 2 hour commitment.

People will also be needed to help with the bounce houses. The City of Yorkville is providing the bounce houses and getting them inflated and ready. Our job will be to stand at the entrance and exit points to make sure there aren't too many kids in at one time and that kids are safely leaving the bounce houses. We will have cards with information about YCUCC activities- like Vacation Bible School- to hand out to parents. Activities in the park start as the parade ends and conclude by 12:30 or 1 p.m. at the latest.

Finally, our location close to where the fireworks will be set off gives us an opportunity to meet with even more community residents in our own parking lot. Last year, the gaga ball pit was set up for kids to use before the fireworks and the church distributed free snow

cones. Again, this is no more than about a two hour commitment.

Each of these activities would allow you to attend your own family picnics, cookouts or pool parties, and still have time to help the church early in the day or in the evening.

We will need MANY of you to help with these fun activities and help spread the word about YCUCC.

Can you help provide lunch for Daybreak Shelter on July 21?

It will be YCUCC's turn to provide lunch for Daybreak Homeless Shelter again on Friday, July 21. The menu will be sloppy joe, coleslaw, chips and dessert.

We asked the Daybreak food coordinator what other meal we might bring. Her response was "Please keep bringing sloppy joes- the guests love it and no other group brings it." So we'll do it again!

As the number of guests at Daybreak has increased, we now need: five 3-pound batches of sloppy joe, a total of 88 hamburger buns, four 2.75 pound tubs of coleslaw (Jewel's Signature brand is 2.75 pounds, but any brand is OK), 60 individual servings of applesauce, four bags of barbecue potato chips, two bags of regular potato chips, and three desserts.

NAME FOR NEW PARK: COUNTRYSIDE PAVILION PARK

When we offered church members for their ideas, 28 different names were suggested. (The names submitted are listed below.) It was great to see a lot of interest.) Green Team reviewed the names and unanimously agreed with the final choice that we gave to the City of Yorkville. We ruled out any names with religious references, especially as this will be a public park. We also eliminated names that were to honor a person, as there are so many well-respected people who have helped to shape this church.

We wanted to keep the word **COUNTRYSIDE**, as that will identify our location. Countryside Center was built on "country" land at the north "side" of Yorkville.

The word **PAVILION** has multiple meanings. First, the park will have a pavilion, which will also identify a really attractive feature of the new park. The word pavilion does not have a religious meaning; the name needs to be appropriate for a "public" park. However, the name "**Pavilion**" actually has a long and rich history connected to our church.

The person who submitted the name, actually wrote an explanation based on the history of our church, which is the oldest church in Kendall County. This is what they wrote:

"Pavilion Park" is my idea for naming the new recreation area south of our church. There will be a <u>pavilion</u> in the park for all to enjoy. But the name could also remind the community of our long history in Kendall County.

The Yorkville Congregational Church (YCUCC) is the oldest church in Kendall County because we have the legacy of 3 churches: 1834 <u>Pavilion</u> Baptist Church, 1834 Bristol Baptist, and 1836 First Congregational Church.1920 the three churches merged and Yorkville Federated Church began. 1940 <u>Pavilion</u> Baptist was torn down and the lumber, including hand-hewn beams [which] became part of a corn crib on the Doetschman Farm, Rt 71.

When the current building was built [1989], Charles Doetschman worked together with Bob Johnston to fashion the walnut beams into a cross. So the wood from the original <u>Pavilion</u> Baptist Church decorates our alter today."

As you can see, the word **Pavilion** would be an excellent identifier and will attract people to this particular park. In addition, the word will be a great reminder of the history of our Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ, evolving from the oldest church in Kendall County.

At our last meeting, Green Team talked about getting a plaque with the explanation for the name. The plaque can include a QR code that can be clicked by any smart phone and the code will link directly to the church's website. We will find an appropriate place on the "church" property near the park to put the plaque. (Note: The City's legal document states the park name as Countryside Pavilion Park.)




