



Green Team News

Countryside Pavilion Park - updates

- In the past few weeks, Shepherds Leadership Team Reviewed the Agreement, Legal Description, and Plat with the City of Yorkville and voted to approve the legal agreement. Deanna Bazan, SLT Chairperson, and Tim Andrus, SLT Operations Finance Shepherd, signed the agreement on July 20th.
- After the City of Yorkville gives final approval, excavation of the park property will begin in August. Watch for developments of the playground, pavilion concrete floor, pads for bins, a paved parking lot and landscaping.

FIVE Simple Energy Saving Practices

- According to the US Department of Energy, "you can save as much as 10% per year on heating and cooling by simply turning your **thermostat** up or back 7-10 degrees for 8 hours a day from its normal settings."
- 2. Did you know that just by using a lid to **cover a pot on the stove top**, you can reduce your energy use by up to two-thirds? It allows you to heat food faster, saving you both time and effort.
- 3. A full bath may be luxurious and relaxing, but it's also very wasteful. An average bathtub can take up to 70 gallons of water to fill, while a **5-minute shower** uses just 10 25 gallons.
- 4. During the summer months use the **dishwasher and/or washer/dryers** at night or early in the morning. Don't use them during the peak hours of 2 p.m. to 8 p.m. to avoid the highest electrical cost. Off peak hours are from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m. However, you should never leave the appliances on overnight since this could become a fire risk.
- 5. The microwave is your friend. **Microwave** ovens use up to 80% less energy than a conventional oven does. It also cooks faster, leaving more time to commit to other environmentally-friendly activities!




Adult Education


