## October is Fire Safety Month!

BUILDING GROUNDS Here are some friendly fire safety reminders from the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services:

- 1. Install smoke detectors and check them regularly. You should have a working smoke detector on each floor of your house and in each sleeping room. As of January 1, 2023 all new smoke alarms being installed in homes are required to feature a 10– year sealed battery. If you do not have a 10-year battery in your smoke detector, it is important to change the batteries twice a year, when you change your clocks for Daylight Savings.
- 2. Make a fire escape plan. What happens if there is a fire in your home? What is the quickest and safest way to get your family out of your home? Draw a map of your home and find out the safest way out of each room. It is also important to have a designated safe zone once you have exited your home.
- **3. Be careful with electricity.** Do not run electrical cords under rugs. Replace appliances that smoke or give off unusual odors when in use. Do not overload electrical outlets.
- **4. Be careful when cooking.** Never leave the stove unattended when you are cooking. Keep pot and panhandles turned inward-children can knock or pull down pots and pans and seriously injure themselves. Never throw water or flour on a grease fire because it will only make it worse!

If an item of clothing catches fire, the quickest and safest way to put the fire out is to STOP, DROP, and ROLL. Practice this technique with your family.

Make sure children know when and how to call 911, and what to say.

#### HANG CLOTHES TO DRY

#### INSTALL WINDOW SHADES. **BLINDS OR SHUTTERS**



Shading your windows can keep your home cooler. Consider adding awnings or shutters, especially to windows that face south or west. Save up to \$20 per year.

#### ADJUST THE DISPLAY ON YOUR TV AND COMPUTER



The default display settings on many TVs and computers are energy intensive and often unnecessarily bright. Depending on the model, turning down your TV's brightness can reduce its power use without compromising image quality.

The next soup Sunday will be on October 8th, with proceeds going to "Special Olympics". Look for the sign up sheet on the bulletin board in the Narthex to help out.


#### **Stewardship Ministry News**


#### **Adult Education**

As the adult education coordinator, I aim to provide opportunities for adults to explore their faith, feed their souls, and reach out and seek understanding of others.



Here are four books I recommend to learn more about this month. Look for Woman of Light and Mexican Gothic in our church library. I have read all four and they were all excellent!


