## Pastor's Porch

Dear Church Family,

In our news, there is a continual inundation with images from Gaza, Israel, Ukraine, Russia, and many other localized violent conflicts. The painting is Picasso's Guernica, painted during the Spanish Civil War in 1937. Spanish Nationalists requested that German and Italian planes



bomb cities. The images in the painting reflect total war, which is when human casualties are not only soldiers. Often, there is a conversation about creating "A Just War." The Just War concept dates back to St. Augustine. "A Just Peace" is an alternate way to consider wars as naturally unjust. As a history student, I understand how governments see the need for war, and as a Christian, it is hard for me to understand any war as "Just."

A Just Peace grounds itself in God's Justice, the actions of kindness and care in this world. It does not look at a war with winners and losers. Instead, it looks at the harm and brutality of war on the human body, the Earth, and the spirit. Picasso's Guernica depicts a woman holding a light shining on the injury and death in war. "A woman weeps over a dead child, a dead soldier lies below with a severed arm and a broken sword, an injured horse cries out in pain under an evil eye with a light bulb, the Spanish word for light bulb and bomb being the same." writes Susan Thisliwate, "A Just Peace," theologian. Working towards "A Just Peace" creates a world where we see God in everything and surrounding everything. By eliminating injustice, we make peace. Kindness sews the seeds of peace.

**Where do we go from here?** I look to understand scriptures used to sew injustice instead of justice, God's kindness. Sometimes, pacifism is seen as giving in and not working on building our communities grounded in God's love. Pacifism is seeing the pain, struggle, and horror of violence in our world, like in Guernica, and then responding by working toward justice. **Where do we go from here?** We begin with the instructions from Micah that the "Lord requires of us (you) but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?" Micah 6:8. Together, we build our empathy and compassion muscles to understand perspectives and contexts other than our own as a building block to sewing God's justice in the world.

### What's happening in Building and Grounds? By Alex Houle, Admin Assistant

During the month of April, the building and grounds crew has spent more time collecting quotes and planning and finalizing their capital expenditures and budget. We have signed a new contract with Gordon Flesch and will be getting our new copier delivered on June 12<sup>th</sup>. We have signed a new contract with Powers Painting to paint the beige gables on the west side of the church to match the rest of the building. Additionally, in lieu of replacing the carpet this year, we've decided that the parking lot needs the attention more. We are currently collecting quotes now to have the parking lot repaired/filled where needed, have the cracks filled, get the whole lot seal coated, and have new stripes for parking spots painted.

B&G has been making the church nicer in many ways too. We installed a new French drain on the west side of the building (outside of Robin's office). We installed a new deadbolt in Pastor Elizabeth's office to eliminate access from the exterior. We have created new maintenance trackers for all the furnaces, AC units, and boilers and we have inspections for the AC units on May 14<sup>th</sup>. We've also got our patio set put out back so we can all enjoy this wonderful spring weather.

Currently, we have all hands-on deck to set up for the rummage and bake sale. We are setting up, picking up donations, and then cleaning it all up at the end. As for the grounds, we purchased a couple pounds of white clover seed to plant a "test plot" in the grass. The hope is to decrease or even eliminate the need for fertilizer. Finally, coming this summer, we have an Eagle Scout project planned to install a twelve-foot square brick patio on the west side of the church.

Building and Grounds continues to meet every Tuesday at 9:00 am. All are welcome!

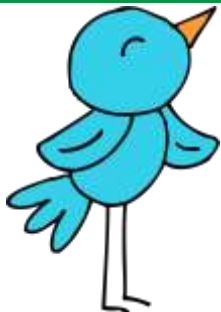

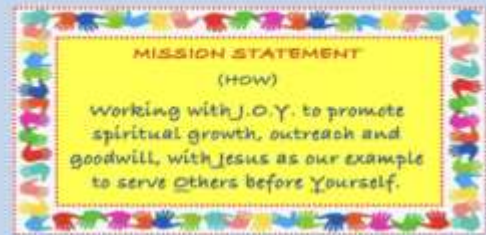


# The Road to Nashville: Sponsor-A-Mile!

## Green Team News STEWARDS OF OUR EARTH

A SOLAR PANEL AWNING on the west side of the church will consist off 28 solar panels. effectively collecting about 80% of available sun energy. Independent Renewable Energy (IRE) from Sandwich, IL will construct the frames and install the panels within the next couple of months. The west-side awning will be similar to the awning on the south side in both design and materials.

Phase II will offset the carbon footprint of our church by around 20% producing 12,400 kWh per year.

Phase II will save approximately 20% of the cost of electric. (Phase I saves approximately 21% of the cost of electric. )

The fully installed system cost will be \$50,500. The funding will NOT come from the church's operating budget. Rather, it will be funded through various sources: the separate Environmental Fund, Investment Tax Credit Rebate, Solar Renewable Energy Credit (SREC), Domestic Content Credit, and \$20,600 of Bridge Loans (from members of the congregation). Now is a very good time to put up solar panels which will qualify the church to receive the available rebates and credits.

Phase II, estimated savings for the church will be \$1,152 the first year, \$6,100 by the fifth year, and \$39,000 after 25 years.

As the adult education shepherd, I aim to provide opportunities for adults to explore their faith, feed their souls, and reach out and seek understanding of others.

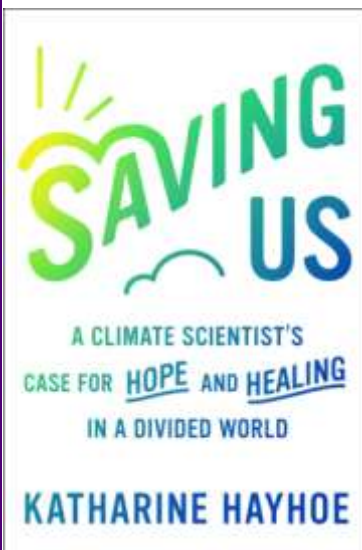
### Facebook Groups

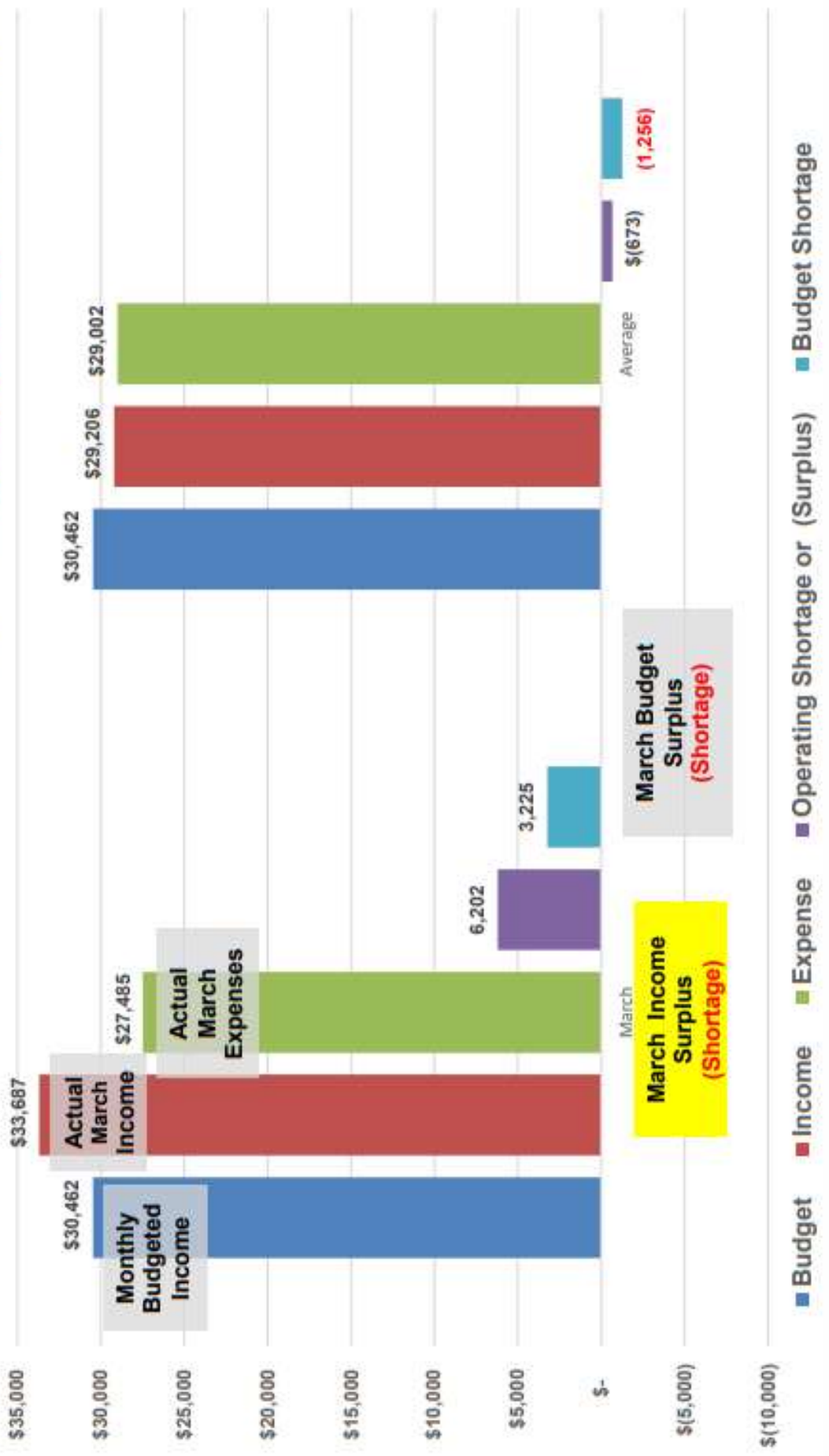
