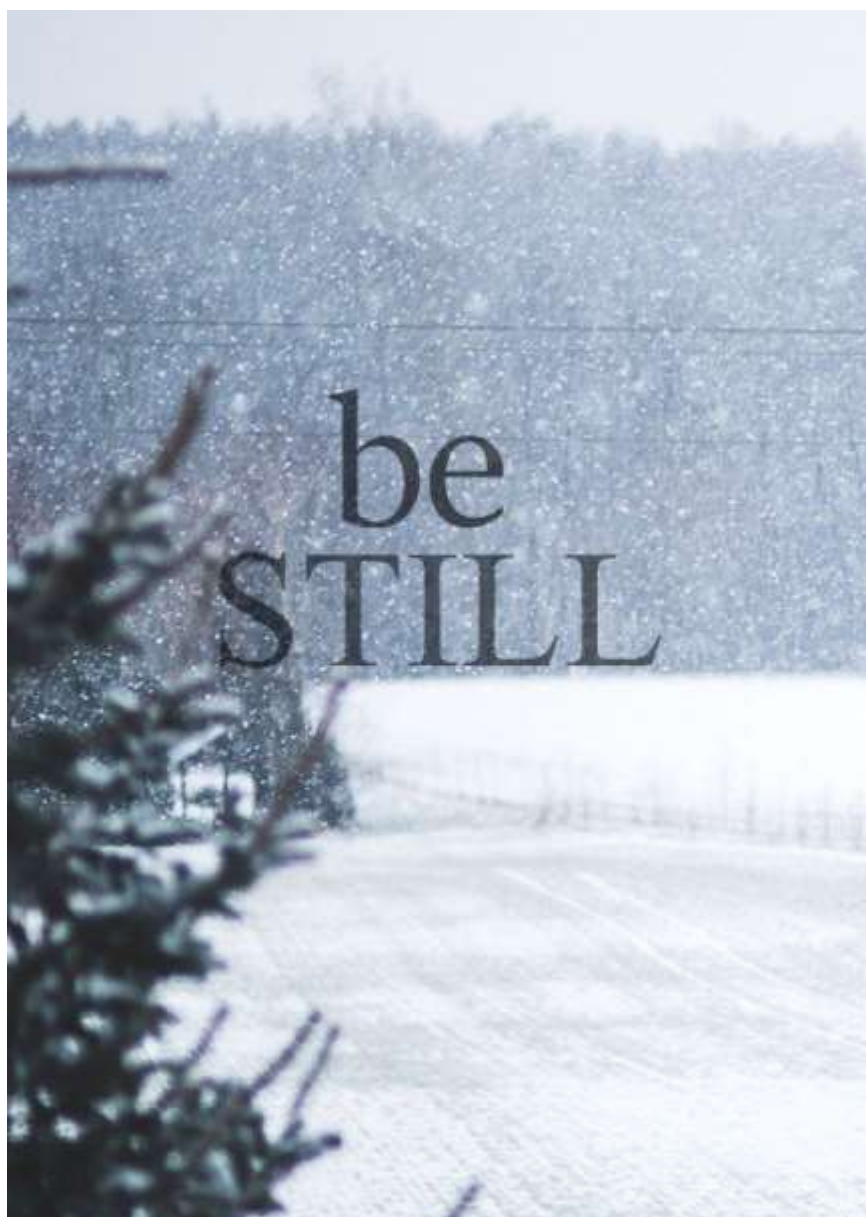

Currents of Faith: Stirring the Pot of Hope and Gratitude

Dear Church Family,

As we approach the end of the year, I've been reflecting on how ministry is like making a hearty pot of soup—dynamic, intentional, and full of care. Each ingredient represents our unique contributions as individuals, blending together to create something nourishing that sustains and strengthens our community. This image beautifully connects with the **Currents of Faith** sermon series beginning in January, where scripture reminds us of God's faithfulness and abundance and with Howard Thurman's words in *Blessings at Year's End*.

Thurman writes:

"I remember the awareness of the spirit of God that sought me out in my aloneness and gave to me a sense of assurance that undercut my despair and confirmed my life with new courage and abiding hope."

In **"Through the Waters: Unshaken Faith" (Isaiah 43:1-7)**, we hear God's promise: *"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you."* Like a pot of soup stirred through turbulent times, this passage assures us of God's steadfast presence, transforming our challenges into moments of strength and renewal. Thurman's reflection on God seeking us in our aloneness echoes this promise, reminding us that God's abiding hope carries us even through life's storms.

In **"Pour It Out: Trusting Wisdom" (John 2:1-11)**, Mary's words to the servants—*"Do whatever he tells you"*—call us to trust in Jesus' wisdom and guidance. Thurman writes:

"I remember the fruits of the labors of others, which I have shared as a part of the normal experience of daily living."

Like water turned into wine, our faith invites us to pour out our gifts, trusting that God can transform them into blessings for others. This transformation reflects the shared labor of our church family, where each contribution becomes part of something more significant in God's hands.

In **"Joy as Our Strength: Streams of Renewal" (Nehemiah 8:1-10)**, we are invited to *"eat the fat and drink sweet wine, and send portions to those for whom nothing is prepared."* Thurman recalls: *"I remember the beautiful things that I have seen, heard, and felt—some as a result of seeking on my part, and many that came unheralded into my path, warming my heart and rejoicing my spirit."* Sharing joy and nourishment with others brings renewal, not only to those we serve but to our own spirits as well. In these acts of generosity, we find the beauty of God's love at work in our community.

Thurman's words and the scriptures in this series remind us to reflect on God's presence in our lives. Ministry, like making soup, requires intention, care, and trust in the process. As we prepare to enter a new year, may we give thanks for the blessings we've received, the challenges that have shaped us, and the hope that continues to guide us forward. Together, we can stir the pot of faith, spreading love, joy, and renewal to all who hunger for connection.

"I remember the dreams that haunted me during the year, keeping me mindful of goals and hopes which I did not realize but from which I drew inspiration to sustain my life and keep steady my purposes."

May God bless us with courage, joy, and abiding hope in the year ahead.

Movie Discussion

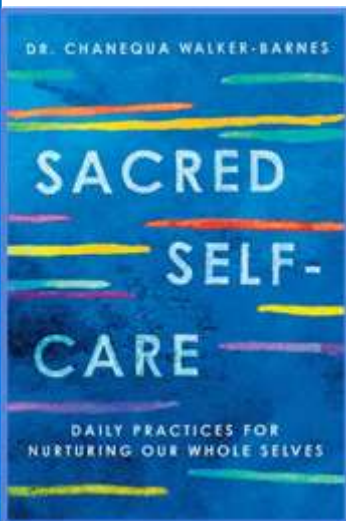


Bonhoeffer: Pastor. Spy. Assassin.

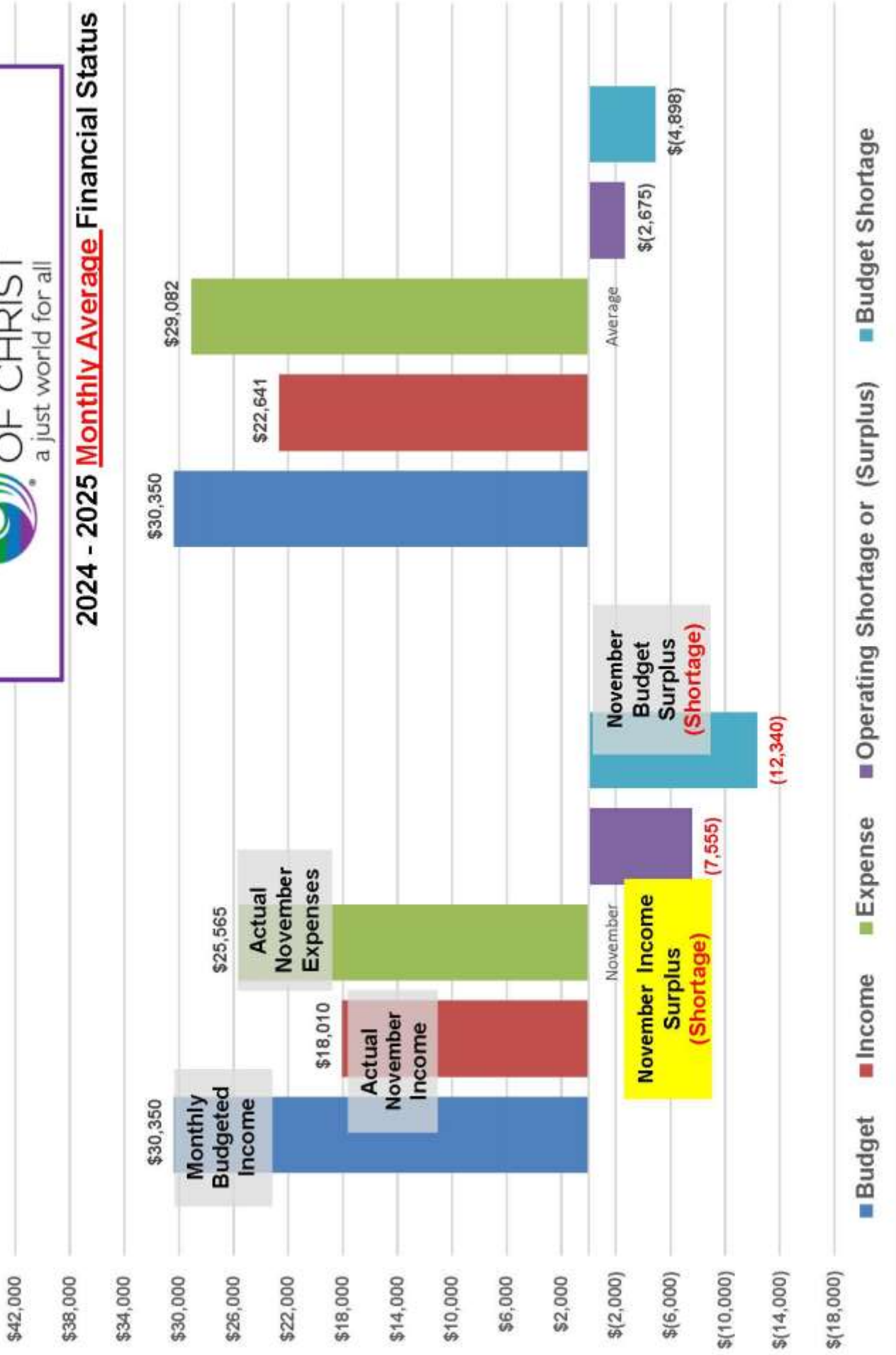
