# Showing Up: Living as Resurrection People

"Let us not neglect meeting together... but encourage one another" – Hebrews 10:25

Showing up. It sounds so simple, and yet it's one of the most powerful things we can do as people of faith.

In the everydayness of our lives, there are moments when simply being present—with one another and for one another—becomes a sacred act. Ministry happens not just on Sunday mornings, but in the ways we show up for our neighbors, respond to needs, and celebrate community. This summer, we're committed to showing up in bold, joyful, and grace-filled ways.

**Hebrews 10:25-26** reminds us that when we gather and build one another up, we are participating in the ongoing work of God. We don't do this to earn God's love—we do it to reflect the love we've already received. As resurrection people, we are called to nurture life, hope, and connection. And every time we show up, we create opportunities for new life to blossom in our community.

Here are just a few of the ways we are showing up this summer:

Our new sermon series, *What We're Saying*, will explore the heart of our message as a church: a message of liberation, connection, courage, and belonging. Each Sunday, we'll reflect on scripture, lift our voices in song, and share stories that help us live out our faith with honesty and hope.

# What We're Saying

A Sermon Series on Faith, Action, and Belonging

# June 1 – Freedom Breaks Through (Communion Sunday)

**Scripture:** *Acts* 16:16–34

**Focus Verse:** Acts 16:26 – "Suddenly there was an earthquake so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened."

Main Message: God can break through anything that holds us back—God shows up when we feel trapped or stuck.

**Story/Image:** Paul and Silas in prison—working hard, singing in the dark, and trusting God through it all, like working a hard job and still holding on to hope.

### June 8 – God's Spirit Speaks (Pentecost)

Scripture: Acts 2:1–21

Focus Verse: Acts 2:4 - "All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability."

**Main Message:** God helps us speak and connect—even when we feel different or unsure. **Story/Image:** Dandelions—everywhere, spreading life in unexpected places, just like the Spirit sends us out with purpose.

## June 15 – Proclaiming Peace Today (Trinity Sunday)

Scripture: Romans 5:1-5

Focus Verse: Romans 5:1 – "Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."

**Main Message:** Faith gives us peace to face the world, even when things are messy or unfair. **Story/Image:** A calm heart during a challenging conversation—God's peace can help us breathe, listen, and care even when life feels too big.

June 22 - We Live by Faith, Not by Sight (Youth Sunday) Scripture: 2 Corinthians 5:6-10, 14-17 Focus Verse: 2 Corinthians 5:7 – "For we walk by faith, not by sight."

**Main Message:** We don't have to see everything clearly to trust where God is leading.

**Story/Image:** Like walking in the dark with someone we trust—youth will share how they keep moving forward even when they don't have all the answers.

# June 29 - Pride and Proclamation (Pride Sunday)

Scripture: Luke 9:51-62

Focus Verse: Luke 9:51 – "When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem."

Main Message: Jesus chose a path of courage and truth—and so can we.

Story/Image: Pauli Murray—someone who spoke up for justice even when it was hard, reminding us that being true to who we are is part of our faith.

This summer, let's continue to show up with intention, joy, and the courage to be God's people. Let's show up because love lives here and in us.






All are welcome to check out the garden located in the back of the building near the Gaga Ball pit.








