

#### Pastor's Porch Money, God, and the Circle Wide

In Luke 16, Jesus gives us two powerful stories about money. First, he recounts a story about a manager who rewrites the accounts to protect his own future. Then he speaks of a rich man who feasted every day while Lazarus, poor and sick, lay at his gate. When the two die, their situations are reversed.

Lazarus finds comfort in God's embrace while the rich man is left alone. It is a stark reminder that wealth without compassion creates a great chasm between people.

John Wesley once said that Christians should gain all they can, save all they can, and give all they can. By this, he meant that money itself is not the problem. Money is neutral. It is the way we use it and discuss it that tells the story of our lives. Used selfishly, it narrows our world and closes us off from others. Used faithfully, it becomes a tool for love, compassion, and justice.

As a church, we live in that truth every day. We need to care for the space God has given us. That means maintaining our building, replacing carpet, and tending to our grounds so that they remain safe, welcoming, and ready for ministry. But our stewardship does not end there. A church that loves also shows up in the community. We show care in worship, in education, in fellowship, and in the ways we extend kindness and compassion beyond our walls.

The parable of Lazarus asks us to notice who is at our gate and how we respond. It asks us what story our money tells. Does it serve only our comfort, or does it widen the circle so that all may know the love of God?

As we continue our Draw the Circle Wide series, we remember that money is not the goal. It is simply the tool. The true goal is God's kingdom, where the circle of love is wide enough for every child of God.



The church needs a face lift, or shall I say a ground lift? Our carpets are over 30 years old, and they are showing their years in spades. It is now becoming a safety issue with buckling and waffling driving the trip meter high. Over the past several

months, B&G has been busy obtaining several quotes for the most economical carpeting in hopes of something as durable and eye-pleasing as the one we currently have. We need YOUR help to make this happen. The plan is to fundraise half the cost (~\$10K) and use out Capital Fund for the remaining amount. Look for donation envelopes to help keep our church home safe, functional and beautiful.

Your church family wants to be able to help you in times of need. Would you be willing to update your emergency contact person with us so we could contact someone in case we could not reach you in a time of need? There is a form <u>attached</u> and more available at the welcome center.

The Care Team is a group of caring people from the congregation trained to listen, care and remain confidential with you for any of life's struggles. Whether you are lonely from a child leaving for college, experiencing financial struggles, or grieving the loss of a loved one, this group is here to listen and help you as you walk your journey. The process of becoming a WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, Engaged) Congregation for Mental Health is underway. This will let those in the community living with mental health challenges, the neurodivergent community, and substance abuse challenges know we are a safe environment for worship. The next step will be developing an inclusive statement of intent for our Congregation and sending this to the UCC Mental Health Network.

The Little Pantry and Little Library are both still serving our community quite well. Items are rotated weekly. Donations are welcomed and appreciated (bins are at the back of the sanctuary). "Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart."—Psalm 37:4

#### Preparing for Your Future - decisions about taxes and health care

On **Sunday, November 2, 11:15 - 12:15**, Green Team will host professional speakers— one who will present some options for our long-term investments, and another will talk to us about estate planning and end-of-life directives.

Jonathan Hilton, CFP, Wealth Advisor from Clear Perspectives, Aurora, will share options about managing our tax-deferred investments including Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs). In addition, we will have a local expert to speak to us about decisions regarding our legal "end-of-life directives" for health and finances.

Is it possible to take out your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your investments and NOT be taxed on that amount? YES. Find out how to do this.

Have you made legal plans for your personal Advanced Directives — a living will? Health care power or attorney? Mental health treatment preference declaration? Are your documents up to date? Bring your questions.

On **Sunday November 2,** right after church service, pick up a tray with a light lunch, and head back into the sanctuary to listen and learn. "The More You Know... " will make you smarter as you plan for your future.




For those of you wondering why there is a hole in the ground surrounded with yellow caution tape at the south east corner of the church near the little library, the answer is that it is a Rain Garden. The Green Team has embraced this endeavor to demonstrate to our church members and to the community the benefits of a Rain Garden.

RAIN GARDEN A Rain Garden is a shallow depression that collects rain water that has run off hard surfaces like rooftops and parking lots. It allows the water to slowly sin in, instead of running off to a storm sewer. The garden's flowering perennials and grasses, filter the runoff, collect pollutants, sequester carbon, provide habitat and food for pollinators, improve the water quality of streams sand rivers and reduce the storm sewer needs of your community.

The plan at this time is to continue to plant native plants this fall and spring, and to purchase and install an informative sign explaining the benefits of the Rain Garden. The next step is to wait for the plants to grow. As the gardeners in the congregation know, the first year they sleep, the next year they creep and the third year they leap. It's not the instant gratification most Americans want, but it's a good long term investment.

The YCUCC has a long history of working to be a positive force in our community and the world. Hopefully this demonstration project of good stewardship will inspire some to make a small step to improve the environment.

"In a time of intense political polarization, we are facing an unprecedented number of attempts to ban books. Books by authors of color, by LGBTQ+ authors, by women and books about racism, sexuality, gender, history are the ones most often targeted by bans. When some seek to police access to some experiences, some histories, some understandings, some ideas, the image of God is dimmed. Without these books, our encounters with the amazing diversity of creation are incomplete, and our capacity for compassion across difference is stymied. Our love of God is limited because we do not have the chance to recognize all the ways the divine image is manifest in our world.




